1	A MOTION providing direction to the conservation futures
2	citizen oversight committee on priorities for allocating
3	conservation futures tax levy funds.
4	WHEREAS, RCW 84.34.010 declares that it is in the best interest of the state to
5	maintain, preserve, conserve and otherwise continue in existence adequate open space
6	lands for the production of food, fiber and forest crops and to ensure the use and
7	enjoyment of natural resources and scenic beauty for the economic and social well-being
8	of the state and its citizens, and
9	WHEREAS, RCW 84.34.210 authorizes the county to acquire property rights "to
10	protect, preserve, maintain, improve, restore, limit the future use of, or other otherwise
11	conserve, selected open space land, farm and agricultural land, and timber land," and
12	WHEREAS, property right acquired under this authorization are defined as
13	conservation futures, and
14	WHEREAS, RCW 84.34.230 authorizes the use of a property tax levy to fund the
15	acquisition of conservation futures and the maintenance and operation of acquired
16	properties, and
17	WHEREAS, RCW 84.34.240 authorizes counties to establish a special
18	conservation futures fund to which the levy proceeds are credited, and
19	WHEREAS, King County has established a conservation futures tax levy and

20 fund, and

WHEREAS, King County is required to establish a process to help ensure, over 21 time, that the distribution of the tax levy is throughout the county, and 22 23 WHEREAS, K.C.C. chapter 26.12 establishes an annual process for distribution of the tax levy to acquire open space lands, including green spaces, greenbelts, wildlife 24 habitat and trail rights-of-way, and 25 26 WHEREAS, the process includes a citizen oversight committee that makes 27 project and funding allocation recommendations for each project to the executive, and WHEREAS, the executive makes project and funding recommendations as part of 28 29 the budget process, and WHEREAS, K.C.C. 26.12.010 allows the council to adopt a motion providing 30 31 direction to the conservation futures citizen oversight committee on priorities for 32 evaluating project applications, and WHEREAS, K.C.C. 26.12.025 establishes criteria for conservation futures project 33 selection, which provides: "wildlife habitat or rare plant reserve; salmon habitat and 34 aquatic resources; scenic resources; community separator; historic or cultural resources; 35 urban passive-use natural area or greenbelt; park or open space system addition; and 36 37 transfer of development rights program implementation. Additional criteria may include: passive recreation; education/interpretive opportunity; threat of loss of open space 38 resources; ownership complexity; partnerships; stewardship and maintenance; and any 39 40 other criteria consistent with RCW 84.34.020," and 41 WHEREAS, Molasses creek is known to be used by fish or meets the physical 42 criteria to be potentially used by fish, and as a result is a valuable resource, both for the

43	local Fairwood community and for the larger Cedar River watershed, and
44	WHEREAS, Molasses creek is in an area identified as an Urban and Natural
45	River Corridor in the executive's Land Conservation and Preservation Work Plan, and
46	WHEREAS, portions of Molasses creek are managed as open space and valuable
47	habitat as part of the Soos Creek park and Soos Creek trail, while other portions of
48	Molasses creek have undergone projects to improve fish passage, preserve and maintain
49	water quality and prevent flooding, and
50	WHEREAS, a number of properties along Molasses creek in unincorporated King
51	County are owned by the King County road services division and have been determined
52	surplus, presenting opportunities to preserve open space, protect a valuable riparian
53	corridor, provide protection for migrating fish and provide opportunities for trail
54	connections, and
55	WHEREAS, use of conservation future tax levy funds for purchase of property
56	rights in the Molasses creek area for wildlife habitat, aquatic resources or open space
57	system addition meets the criteria in K.C.C. 26.12.025;
58	NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT MOVED by the Council of King County:
59	A. The council establishes as a priority for the conservation futures citizen
60	oversight committee's consideration during the annual project selection and funding
61	recommendation process, one or more projects that includes the purchase or property
62	rights for the purpose of wildlife habitat, aquatic resources or open space system addition
63	in or near Molasses creek in the unincorporated Fairwood community, to preserve the
64	existing open space.
65	B. The department of natural resources and parks, water and land resources

- division, is requested to work with landowners and jurisdictions in which properties
- 67 reflecting this priority is located, in submitting project proposals that meet this priority, as
- part of the 2018 conservation futures tax levy funds selection process provided for in
- 69 K.C.C. 26.12.010.
