| 1 | A MOTION providing direction to the conservation futures |
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| 2 | advisory committee on priorities for allocating conservation |
| 3 | futures tax levy funds. |
| 4 | WHEREAS, in RCW 84.34.010, the state Legislature "declares that it is in the |
| 5 | best interest of the state to maintain, preserve, conserve and otherwise continue in |
| 6 | existence adequate open space lands for the production of food, fiber and forest crops and |
| 7 | to ensure the use and enjoyment of natural resources and scenic beauty for the economic |
| 8 | and social well-being of the state and its citizens," and |
| 9 | WHEREAS, RCW 84.34.210 authorizes the county to acquire property rights "to |
| 10 | protect, preserve, maintain, improve, restore, limit the future use of, or other otherwise |
| 11 | conserve, selected open space land, farm and agricultural land, and timber land," and |
| 12 | WHEREAS, property rights acquired under this authorization are defined as |
| 13 | conservation futures, and |
| 14 | WHEREAS, RCW 84.34.230 authorizes the use of a property tax levy to fund the |
| 15 | acquisition of conservation futures and the maintenance and operation of acquired |
| 16 | properties, and |
| 17 | WHEREAS, RCW 84.34.240 authorizes counties to establish a special |
| 18 | conservation futures fund to which the levy proceeds are credited, and |
| 19 | WHEREAS, King County has established a conservation futures tax levy and |

20 fund, and

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WHEREAS, King County is required to establish a process to help ensure, over 21 time, that the distribution of the tax levy is throughout the county, and 22 WHEREAS, K.C.C. chapter 26.12 establishes an annual process for distribution 23 of the tax levy to acquire open space lands, including green spaces, greenbelts, wildlife 24 habitat and trail rights-of-way, and 25 WHEREAS, the process includes an advisory committee that makes project and 26 funding allocation recommendations for each project to the executive, and 27 WHEREAS, the executive makes project and funding recommendations as part of 28 the budget process, and 29 WHEREAS, K.C.C. 26.12.010 allows the council to adopt a motion providing 30 direction to the conservation futures advisory committee on priorities for evaluating 31 project applications, and 32 WHEREAS, K.C.C. 26.12.025 establishes criteria for conservation futures project 33 selection, which are: "wildlife habitat or rare plant reserve; salmon habitat and aquatic 34 resources; scenic resources; community separator; historic or cultural resources; urban 35

WHEREAS, K.C.C. 26.12.025 establishes criteria for conservation rutures project selection, which are: "wildlife habitat or rare plant reserve; salmon habitat and aquatic resources; scenic resources; community separator; historic or cultural resources; urban passive-use natural area or greenbelt; park, open space or natural corridor addition; and passive recreation opportunity in an area with unmet needs; and projects that seek to redress historic disparities in access to or health benefits of open space in opportunity areas. Additional criteria may include: educational or interpretive opportunity; impact to open space resources; feasibility, including ownership complexity, a willing seller or sellers or community support; partnerships; if the property identified in an adopted comprehensive plan, park open space, habitat, cultural resource or community plan;

| 45 | 84.34 RCW," and Motion 15513 gives additional detail on project eligibility criteria, and |
| 46 | WHEREAS, farm and agricultural lands are allowed to be purchased with |
| 47 | conservation futures tax funding, and |
| 48 | WHEREAS, King County first established Agricultural Production Districts |
| 49 | ("APDs") in 1985 to protect over 41,000 acres of agricultural lands of long-term |
| 50 | commercial significance, which are an irreplaceable natural resource, and |
| 51 | WHEREAS, the King County Comprehensive Plan states that uses in APDs must |
| 52 | be conserved for productive use and that all land uses in these districts must be sited and |
| 53 | designed to ensure compatibility with resource management, and |
| 54 | WHEREAS, surveys indicate that only 25,000 out of the 41,000 acres in the |
| 55 | APDs are being actively farmed, and |
| 56 | WHEREAS, the Comprehensive Plan states that King County should encourage |
| 57 | infrastructure and services that support resource management and resource-based |
| 58 | businesses in the APDs and should employ a variety of innovative programs and |
| 59 | incentives to help maintain and enhance resource-based industries, and |
| 60 | WHEREAS, the Comprehensive Plan states that King County should work with |
| 61 | other jurisdictions, agencies, and agriculture interest groups to maintain and enhance |
| 62 | commercial farming activities, and |
| 63 | WHEREAS, the Comprehensive Plan calls on King County to seek funding for, |
| 64 | and purchase additional development rights to, land in the APDs and calls on the county |
| 65 | to develop a long-term strategy for financing protection of farmland and to ensure that |

easements for such are well-managed in the long-term; 66 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT MOVED by the Council of King County: 67 A. The council establishes as a priority for the conservation futures advisory 68 committee's consideration during the annual project selection and funding 69 recommendation process, one or more projects that include the purchase of property 70 rights in Agricultural Production Districts for agricultural activities or conservation. 71 B. The department of natural resources and parks, water and land resources 72 division, is requested to work with landowners and jurisdictions in which properties 73 reflecting these priorities are located, in submitting project proposals that meet this 74

- priority, as part of the 2020 conservation futures tax levy funding selection process
- 76 provided for in K.C.C. 26.12.010.
