1 A MOTION adopting the schedule for King County's move
2 to annual budgeting and fulfilling the requirements of
3 Ordinance 19654.

4 WHEREAS, in November 2022, voters in King County approved a charter
5 amendment to move elections for the county offices of executive, assessor, director of
6 elections, and councilmembers from odd-numbered to even-numbered years, and

7 WHEREAS, the county gradually implemented biennial budgeting over a period
8 of more than ten years with the understanding that biennial budget adoption would take
9 place in non-election years, and

10 WHEREAS, the next four election years for the county offices of executive,
11 assessor, director of elections, and councilmembers are scheduled for 2023, 2025, 2026,
12 and 2028, and

13 WHEREAS, voter approval of the charter amendment puts the county in a
14 circumstance of having the biennial budget adoption process taking place in the 2026 and
15 2028 election years, and

16 WHEREAS, to avoid budget adoption coinciding with election years, the
17 executive must have the flexibility to shift budget development from even-numbered to
18 odd-numbered years, and

19 WHEREAS, state law prohibits the county from adopting a three-year budget but
20 does not prohibit adoption of annual or biennial budgets, and

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21 WHEREAS, the metropolitan King County council adopted Ordinance XXXXX
22 (Proposed Ordinance 2023-0245), and

23 WHEREAS, Ordinance XXXX (Proposed Ordinance 2023-0245) authorizes the
24 council to designate county funds selected for annual budgeting, and

25 WHEREAS, the designation must occur by motion and be transmitted to the
26 executive at least two hundred forty-five days before the end of the current fiscal period;

27 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT MOVED by the Council of King County:

29 adopted as annual budgets for 2025: All county funds.


Motion 16404 was introduced on 7/11/2023 and passed by the Metropolitan King County Council on 9/5/2023, by the following vote:

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
