Proposed No. 2025-0046.1 **Sponsors** Zahilay 1 A MOTION relating to the organization of the council; and 2 amending Motion 11122, Section D, as amended, and OR 3 2-020, Motion 11122, Section G, as amended, and OR 2-4 040, and Motion 11122, Section H, as amended, and OR 2-5 050. 6 WHEREAS, the council has specified by motion the chairs, vice-chairs and 7 members of council committees and provided for any changes to these positions to be 8 made by adoption for a formal legislative motion, and 9 WHEREAS, the charter provides that the council shall elect one of its members as 10 chair, and Motion 10651, Section II, as amended, and OR 1-010 provides that the council 11 shall elect a chair who shall serve at the pleasure of the council for a term of one year, 12 unless otherwise ordered by the council, and 13 WHEREAS, the council has specified by motion the chairs, vice-chairs and members of council committees and provided for any changes to these positions to be 14 15 made by adoption of a formal legislative motion; 16 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT MOVED by the Council of King County: 17 I. Motion 11122, Section D, as amended, and OR 2-020 are hereby amended to 18 read as follows: 19 **OR 2-020. Standing committees - functions.** In addition to any committee otherwise established by law, the committees of the metropolitan King County council 20

21 and their respective functions are established as follows:

A. Budget and fiscal management committee.

- 1. The committee shall consider and make recommendations on: the county revenue and expenditure fiscal structural gap; capital and operating budget appropriations; the sale, lease, or transfer of real property to or by the county; debt and investment proposals; bond issues; the office of economic and financial analysis; levies unless referred to another committee; supplemental appropriations related to the COVID-19 pandemic response; and financial policies.
- 2. The committee shall develop recommendations on policy direction for the county budget, based on the recommendations of other council committees and taking into account the estimated fiscal impacts of state and federal legislation.
- 3. In respect to consideration of the county's proposed annual budget, all members of the council not assigned to the budget and fiscal management committee shall be considered ex officio voting members of the committee.
- B. Committee of the whole. The committee shall consider: issues of interest to the entire council, including appointments to the state legislature and department directors and key subordinate units in the executive branch; the annual legislative program; legislation before the federal, state, and local governments that affect King County; the King County Strategic Plan; oversight of Harborview Medical Center; arts and culture and associated levies, if any; the Puget Sound Taxpayer Accountability Account; gun safety; the immigrant and refugee commission; issues related to the census; the charter review commission; homelessness, including the King County Regional Homelessness Authority; COVID-19 pandemic response, excluding supplemental

44	appropriations; racial equity; gender equity; and other program and policy matters. The
45	committee of the whole shall conduct town hall meetings on issues of significance.
46	C. Government accountability and oversight committee.
47	1. The committee shall consider and make recommendations on:
48	a. improving the efficiency, cost effectiveness, and performance of all
49	branches of county government (legislative, executive, and judicial);
50	b. enhancing oversight, accountability and transparency in King County
51	government, the annual county audit program and federal, state, or county audit reports,
52	the administration of the Public Records Act, capital projects oversight, the Puget Sound
53	Emergency Radio Network, performance measurement and performance management,
54	management organizational structure, and technology management; and
55	c. general government oversight, including customer service, worker safety,
56	and the department of assessments; elections; records and licensing; animal control; cable
57	communications; the county fair; King County international airport; risk management;
58	veterans, and executive services such as telecommunications, facilities management,
59	purchasing, and real property management.
60	2. In the areas within the committee's purview, the committee shall track state
61	and federal legislative action and develop recommendations on policy direction for the
62	county budget.
63	D. Health, housing, and $((H))\underline{h}$ uman services committee.
64	1. The committee shall consider and make recommendations on policies relating
65	to:
66	a. health services provided to the community by county agencies and branches;

b. public health programs, including those related to the protection, promotion,
and provision functions of the department of public health, including the structure of the
public health centers; ((and))
c. human services programs including review of human services-related levies.
and human services programs relating to housing services and programs.
2. In the areas within the committee's purview, the committee shall track state
and federal legislative action and develop recommendations on policy direction for the
county budget.
E. Law and justice committee.
1. The committee shall consider and make recommendations on policies relating
to law, safety, and criminal justice programs, including those related to:
a. implementation of the charter amendments related to the duties of the
sheriff's office; public safety;
b. adult detention; juvenile justice and youth services;
c. superior and district courts; judicial administration; prosecuting attorney;
d. public defense; emergency medical services;
e. office of law enforcement oversight;
f. bail reform; pretrial services;
g. alternatives to incarceration;
h. combating human trafficking;
i. hate crime prevention; and
j. civil rights.

93	1. The committee shall consider and make recommendations on policies relating

101	f. levies to support county roads and bridges;
102	g. emergency management;

105	j. ((housing)) salmon recovery and barriers to recovery such as culverts;
106	k. water and sewer district plans;
107	1. growth management including regional planning, countywide planning
108	policies, ((and)) the Comprehensive Plan, and housing issues relating to growth

110	Comprehensive Plan; and
111	m. resource lands, including agricultural, forestry, and mineral resources.

113	and federal legislative action and develop recommendations on policy direction for the
114	county budget.
115	G. Transportation, economy, and environment committee.
116	1. The committee shall consider and make recommendations on:
117	a. transportation, including passenger ferries, regional trails and public
118	transportation including spending plans for new revenue, if any, and fares and fare equity
119	policies;
120	b. the environment, including:
121	(1) ((salmon recovery and barriers to recovery such as culverts;
122	(2))) energy;
123	(((3))) (2) water quality, including wastewater;
124	((4)) (3) regional parks and open space, including conservations futures tax;
125	(((5))) (4) climate, including levy proposals or bond proposals to finance
126	projects or programs to address, mitigate or respond to climate change and its impacts,
127	and the King County Strategic Climate Action Plan;
128	$((\frac{6}{6}))$ solid waste; and
129	(((7))) (6) surface water management; and
130	c. economic development, including equity and pay disparity.
