1 MOTION NO. 1836

2 A MOTION adopting in concept the recommendations
3 of the Steering Committee of the Policy
4 Development Commission regarding the comprehensive
planning process of King County and
directing the revision of Ordinance 263.

5 WHEREAS, one of the first actions of the King County Council
6 was to adopt through Ordinance 263 a comprehensive planning
7 process for King County, and

8 WHEREAS, it is the continuing intention of the Council for
9 King County to remain a leader in developing and applying
10 responsive and effective comprehensive plans, and

11 WHEREAS, changing conditions, the advent of community
12 planning and executive department reorganization make it necessary
13 to consider revisions to the comprehensive planning process, and

14 WHEREAS, an ad hoc committee of the Policy Development
15 Commission has considered this matter extensively over the past
16 several months and their report has been recommended to the
17 Council for adoption.


18 NOW THEREFORE, BE IT MOVED by the Council of King County:


19 That the attached recommendations of the Steering Committee
20 of the Policy Development Commission for revision of the
21 comprehensive planning process are adopted in concept.

22 BE IT FURTHER MOVED, that the Council recognizes the need
23 for expanded and specific joint efforts between the Council and
24 Executive staffs to implement these recommendations and directs
25 that as a matter of priority Ordinance 263 be revised to reflect
26 these recommendations.
