A MOTION supporting the Upper Snoqualmie Regional Open Space Gateway project and authorizing the Executive to develop a funding and implementation strategy.

WHEREAS, the executive wishes to continue to partner with the Preston community, non-profit land preservation organizations, and other governmental entities to develop a funding strategy for the Upper Snoqualmie Regional Open Space Gateway, and

WHEREAS, the Preston community has developed a comprehensive parks and open space vision, The Upper Snoqualmie Regional Open Space Gateway, which benefits all the citizens of King County and the thousands of users of the I-90 Greenway, and

WHEREAS, the historic Preston community is a vital and integral part of the Mountains to Sound Greenway scenic corridor, and

WHEREAS, the proposal resolves long-standing land use disputes in a manner acceptable to all parties, and

WHEREAS, innovative land use techniques such as transfer of development programs, quality rural environment, and tax incentive programs are available for preserving valuable open space, and

WHEREAS, the Upper Snoqualmie Regional Open Space Gateway will provide significant open space, recreational, water quality, air quality and educational benefits;

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT MOVED by the Council of King County:

The King County executive is hereby authorized to develop and transmit by

October 15, 1997 an acquisition and funding program for the preservation of the properties

critical to the Upper Snoqualmie Regional Open Space Gateway. This acquisition and

funding program shall be developed in cooperation with the Preston community, non-profit

land preservation organizations, and other governmental entities. The funding program

shall include the identification of potential partnerships with non-profit organizations, the

leverage of county funding with state and federal funds, innovative acquisition, financing

mechanisms, and consideration of all available preservation techniques. The properties

targeted for preservation are as follows:

- A. Properties targeted for near-term acquisition
 - Preston Arboretum & Botanical Gardens
 - Upper Snoqualmie Athletic Fields site
 - The Old Preston Mill site
- B. Properties for mid-term acquisition
 - Critical edge properties buffering Preston and the I-90 Greenway
- C. Properties for conservation through the use of incentives
 - The Mitchell Hill Connector properties which connect the I-90
 Greenway corridor to the Grand Ridge properties

The transmittal should also include a conceptual stewardship and maintenance program to ensure that these properties continue to provide significant open space, recreational, water quality, air quality and educational benefits. In order to facilitate the cost effective development and management of the Upper Snoqualmie Regional Open Space Gateway, the conceptual stewardship and maintenance program should include recommendations on future uses, private capital development opportunities, potential joint development and cooperative use agreements with non-profits such as the Preston Arboretum & Botanical Gardens Foundation and sports leagues.


