1	A MOTION adopting the 2012 work program for the law,
2	justice, health and human services committee.
3	WHEREAS, the law, justice, health and human services committee is charged
4	with considering and making policy recommendations relating to:
5	1. Law, safety, criminal justice and emergency management programs
6	including, but not limited to, those related to: public safety; the sheriff's office; adult
7	detention; juvenile justice and youth services; superior and district courts; judicial
8	administration; prosecuting attorney; public defense; therapeutic courts; emergency
9	medical services; emergency management, including disaster response, emergency
10	preparedness and emergency planning;
11	2. Public health programs, including, but not limited to, those related to the
12	protection, promotion and provision functions of the department of public health,
13	including the structure of the public health centers; and
14	3. Human services programs, including, but not limited to: mental illness and
15	chemical dependency; homelessness and homeless housing; and civil rights and social
16	justice, and
17	WHEREAS, the committee shall also consider the implementation of appropriate
18	labor agreements, and

19	WHEREAS, in the areas within the committee's purview, the committee shall
20	track state and federal legislative action and develop recommendations on policy
21	direction for the 2013 annual budget, and
22	WHEREAS, the committee has, therefore, developed a work plan for 2012 to
23	facilitate its review and development of policy options and recommendations on these
24	and other issues, and
25	WHEREAS, the work of the law, justice, health and human services committee
26	centers on two major goals of the adopted King County strategic plan:
27	1. Supporting safe communities and accessible justice system for all; and
28	2. Promoting opportunities for all communities and individuals to realize their
29	full potential, and
30	WHEREAS, in 2012, the committee will review and recommend policies and
31	legislation to the council that further these goals and improve the safety and well-being of
32	our region, and
33	WHEREAS, the committee seeks full council involvement in and support for its
34	work program;
