AN ORDINANCE establishing procedures for the vacation of County roads and providing for compensation to King County.

WHEREAS, under the provisions of Chapter 185, Laws of 1969, First Extraordinary Session, King County may require compensation as a condition precedent to the vacation of County roads.

NOW, THEREFORE,

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE KING COUNTY COUNCIL:

Section 1. Authority: Petitions for the vacation of County roads may be granted by the Council in accordance with the provisions of RCW 36.87 as amended by Chapter 185, Laws of 1969, First Extraordinary Session and King County shall receive compensation as provided for herein.

Section 2. Amount of Compensation: Compensation shall be determined by the Council based upon the appraised value of the vacated road which, for purposes of this ordinance, may be determined from the records of the Department of Assessments.

Section 3. Compensation - Condition Precedent: The compensation determined to be paid shall be a condition precedent to the vacation of any County road and shall be paid to King County by petitioner within 90 days of the recommendation by the County Executive for passage of the specific ordinance pertaining to such vacated road, provided that when a road is vacated for a governmental agency, compensation may be based on the administrative costs of the vacation and original cost of acquisition. In the event of failure of the petitioner to pay such sum within 90 days, the petition for vacation shall be denied. If the original grantor requests vacation of a road for which no public expenditures have been made in the acquisition, improvement, or maintenance of same, and the vacation is granted, the land will revert to the original grantor without charge.

1 Section 4. Deposit: Each petition for vacation of a 2 road shall be accompanied by a bond or cash deposit of \$100, which will be used to defray examination, report, publication, invest-3 igative and other costs connected with the application. 4 rejected petitions, any unused portion of such deposit shall be 5 6 returned to the petitioner. On petitions where vacation is 7 recommended by the County Executive, the unused balance of such 8 deposit shall be applied toward the costs of appraisal. When 9 deemed necessary by the County Executive, he may require an 10 additional deposit to cover appraisal costs. 11 Section 5. Manner of Payment.
