AN ORDINANCE relating to the installation of fire hydrants and water mains in the unincorporated areas of King County. Included are commercial, industrial, institutional and multiple dwelling buildings and areas of plats and subdivisions.

CRDINANCE NO.

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BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF KING COUNTY: Section 1. That the definitions following are a part of this ordinance. That whenever the following terms are used in this ordinance, they shall have the meaning as defined. The definitions given shall not necessarily be limited to the meaning given herein whenever the term is one of common usage in which case the definition shall be augmented and enlarged by accepted use of the term.

a. Approving authority - the approving authority for the several conditions of this ordinance shall be the Director of the King County Building Department or his appointee.

b. Fire department - the term "fire department" shall mean the fire authority normally responsible for fire protection in the area.

c. Water authority - shall mean the Water Department, Water District or other body legally supplying water to fire hydrants in the area.

d. A.W.W.A. - shall mean the American Water Works Association.

e. U.L. - shall mean Underwriters' Laboratories, Inc.
f. U.B.C. - shall mean the Uniform Building Code
as adopted by King County.

g. Public Hydrant - a public hydrant is a fire hydrant so situated and maintained to provide water for fire fighting purposes without restriction as to use for that purpose. The location is such that it is accessible for immediate use of the fire authority at all times. h. Private hydrant - a private hydrant is a fire hydrant so situated and maintained to provide water for fire fighting purposes with restrictions as to use. The location may be such that it is not readily accessible for immediate use by the fire authority for other than certain private property.

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i. Flush type hydrant - a flush type hydrant is a hydrant installed entirely below grade.

j. Fire flow - shall mean the flow of water available for fire fighting a fire at a specific building or within a specific area.

k. Fire Marshal - shall mean the Director of the King County Building Department or his appointee.

Section 2. All buildings constructed in unincorporated areas of King County shall be served by fire hydrants installed as required by this Ordinance. Such hydrants shall be served by a water district, or city, or by other adequate means as approved by the Fire Marshal. The water authority and fire department shall be notified in writing when the system is available for use.

Section 3. All hydrants shall be subject to testing and inspection by the fire department.

Section 4. The installation of flush type hydrants is prohibited unless approved by the Fire Marshal.

Section 5. Standard fire hydrants shall be installed

as follows:

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31 32 In midition, hidrant spacing shall be predicated upon hydrants being located at street intersections. Public buildings, including schools, located in single family residential areas shall be classified as Commercial for fire protection purposes.

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32 33 Section 6. All hydrants newly installed in single family residential areas shall be supplied by not less than six (6) inch circulating mains. Dead end mains supplying fire hydrants must be at least eight (8") inches in diameter, except hydrant leads up to fifty (50') feet long may be six (6") inches in diameter.

Section 7. This section applies to all buildings located so that a portion is more than 200 feet from a street property line as measured by vehicular travel.

EXCEPTION: Detached single family dwellings.

a. Buildings having required fire flows of less than 2500 GPM, may have fire hydrants on one side of the building only.

b. When the required fire flow is over 2500 GPM, the fire hydrants shall be served by a main which loops around the building or complex of buildings and re-connects back into the distribution supply main.

c. The number of fire hydrants shall be determined on an average spacing of 300 feet computed on an imaginary line parallel to and not less than fifty (50') feet from the structure. All hydrants are to be accessible to fire department pumpers over roads capable of supporting such fire apparatus. The Fire Marshal shall determine the location of the hydrants depending on utility, topography and building location. Hydrants shall be a minimum of fifty (50') feet out from the building, minor deviation may be granted.

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d. The lead from the service main to the hydrant shall be
2 no less than six (6") inches in diameter. Any hydrant leads over
3 fifty (50') feet in length from service main to the hydrant shall be
4 no less than eight (8") inches in diameter. The provisions of this
5 section shall apply without exception and regardless of the size of
6 the service main.

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Section 8. Standard hydrants shall have: two (2) two 7 and one-half $\binom{1}{2}$ inch hose outlets and one (1) four (4") inch I.D. 8 pumper port outlet. All four (4") inch outlet ports shall be 9 10 approved by the fire department having jurisdiction, and have 11 national standard thread or City of Seattle thread as predominates 12 in the area. Main valve opening shall be no less than five (5") 13 inches. Hydrants shall meet current A.W.W.A. standards for public 14 hydrants and may meet U.L. standards for private standards.

15 Section 9. Fire hydrants shall be installed to meet 16 sound engineering practices. There shall be an auxiliary gate 17 valve installed between the service main and the hydrant sufficient 18 to permit the repair and replacement of the hydrant without dis-19 ruption of water service. The location of all valves and fire 20 hydrants installed shall be properly and accurately marked on 21 identifiable plans or drawings, two copies of which shall be 22 furnished the Fire Marshal.

23 Section 10. Hydrants shall stand plumb, be set to the 24 finished grade with the lowest outlet of the hydrant no less than 25 eighteen (18") inches above the grade and no less than thirty-six 26 (36") inches of clear area about the hydrant for clearance of 27 hydrant wrench on both outlets and on the control valve. The 28 pumper port shall face the street. Where the street cannot be 29 clearly defined or recognized, the port shall face the most likely 30 route of approach and location of the fire truck while pumping as 31 determined by the Fire Marshal.

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Section II. Fire hydrants shall be protected against damage by vehicles.

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Section 12. If there presently exist fire hydrants which do not conform to the requirements of this ordinance, such hydrants when replaced shall be replaced with hydrants which do conform to the standards defined herein.

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Section 13. Hydrants shall not be obstructed by any structure or vegetation or have the visibility impaired for a distance of fifty (50') feet in the direction of vehicular approach to the hydrant.

Section 14. For the purpose of this ordinance, the fire flow requirement shall be applied by the Fire Marshal based upon the following criteria:

Section 15. The passage of this Ordinance is necessary for the protection of health, safety, and welfare of the citizens of King County, Washington. No building permit shall be issued until plans, which are in compliance with this Ordinance, have been submitted and approved. No building shall be occupied until water is available.

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Section 16. Any violation of this Ordinance constitutes a misdemeanor which may be punishable by a fine of \$250.00 or by imprisonment in the county jail for a period not to exceed ninety (90) days or by both such fine and imprisonment. The imposition of criminal penalty shall not preclude the enforcement of all other provisions of this ordinance.

Section 17. If any clause, paragraph or section hereof shall be adjudged invalid, such adjudication shall not affect any other clause, paragraph or section not so adjudicated.
