

1 AN ORDINANCE of the County of King, Washington
2 adopting Titles 1 - 3 of the "King County Code,"
3 a codification of the permanent and general
4 Ordinances of the County of King, Washington

5 BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF KING COUNTY:

6 Section 1. Adoption. Pursuant to the requirement of King
7 County Charter Section 880, there is hereby adopted Titles 1 - 3
8 of the "King County Code" as compiled by Book Publishing Company,
9 Seattle, Washington.

10 Section 2. Title--Citation--Reference. This code shall be
11 known as the "King County Code" and it shall be sufficient to
12 refer to said code as the "King County Code" in any prosecution
13 for the violation of any provision thereof or in any proceeding,
14 at law or equity. It shall be sufficient to designate any ordinance
15 adding to, amending, correcting or repealing all or any part or
16 portion thereof as an addition to, amendment to, correction or
17 repeal of the "King County Code." Further, reference may be had
18 to the titles, chapters, sections and subsections of the "King
19 County Code" and such reference shall apply to that numbered title,
20 chapter, section or subsection as it appears in the code.

21 Section 3. Reference applies to all amendments. Whenever
22 a reference is made to this code as the "King County Code" or to
23 any portion thereof, or to any ordinance of the County of King,
24 Washington the reference shall apply to all amendments, corrections
25 and additions heretofore, now or hereafter made.

26 Section 4. Title, chapter and section headings. Title,
27 chapter and section headings contained herein shall not be deemed
28 to govern, limit, modify or in any manner affect the scope, meaning
29 or intent of the provisions of any title, chapter or section hereof.

30 Section 5. Prohibited acts include causing, permitting, etc.
31 Whenever in this code any act or omission is made unlawful, it shall
32 include causing, allowing, permitting, aiding, abetting, suffering,
or concealing the fact of such act or omission.

Section 6. Construction. The provisions of this code and
all proceedings under it are to be construed with a view to effect

1 its objects and to promote justice.

2 Section 7. Reference to specific ordinances. The provisions
3 of this code shall not in any manner affect deposits or other
4 matters of record which refer to, or are otherwise connected with
5 ordinances which are therein specifically designated by number or
6 otherwise and which are included within the code, but such
7 reference shall be construed to apply to the corresponding provi-
8 sions contained within this code.

9 Section 8. Effect of code on past sections and obligations.
10 Neither the adoption of this code nor the repeal or amendments
11 hereby of any ordinance or part or portion of any ordinance of the
12 county shall in any manner affect the prosecution for violations of
13 ordinances, which violations were committed prior to the effective
14 date hereof, nor be construed as a waiver of any license, fee, or
15 penalty at said effective date due and unpaid under such ordinances,
16 nor be construed as affecting any of the provisions of such ordi-
17 nances relating to the collection of any such license, fee or
18 penalty, on the penal provisions applicable to any violation there-
19 of, nor to affect the validity of any bond or cash deposit in lieu
20 thereof required to be posted, filed or deposited pursuant to any
21 ordinance, and all rights and obligations thereunder appertaining
22 shall continue in full force and effect.

23 Section 9. Repeal shall not revive any ordinances. The
24 repeal of an ordinance shall not repeal the repealing clause of
25 such ordinance or revive any ordinance which has been repealed
26 thereby.

27 Section 10. Exclusions. Every special ordinance of the
28 county governing the following subject matter whether contained in
29 whole or in part within this code, is not affected by the operation
30 and effect of the code. Annexations; franchises, naming roads,
31 streets and public places, acquisition or disposal of public
32 property; vacation of streets, alleys or public ways; acceptance

1 of any gift, devise, license or other benefit; provided that the
 2 foregoing enumeration of exceptions or exclusions shall not be
 3 deemed to be exclusive or exhaustive, it being the intent and
 4 purpose to exclude from repeal any and all ordinances not of a
 5 general nature.

6 Section 11. Effective date. This code shall become effec-
 7 tive on the date the ordinance adopting this code as the "King
 8 County Code" shall become effective.

9 Section 12. Constitutionality. If any section, subsection,
 10 sentence, clause or phrase of this code is for any reason held to
 11 be invalid or unconstitutional, such decision shall not affect the
 12 validity of the remaining portions of this code. The council hereby
 13 declares that it would have passed this code, and each section,
 14 subsection, sentence, clause and phrase thereof, irrespective of
 15 the fact that any one or more sections, subsections, sentences,
 16 clauses or phrases had been declared invalid or unconstitutional,
 17 and if for any reason this code should be declared invalid or
 18 unconstitutional, then the original ordinance or ordinances shall
 19 be in full force and effect.
