

1 AN ORDINANCE relating to the codification
 2 of the ordinances and resolutions of King
 3 County, amending Section 42 (a) and (b),
 4 Resolution 28232 and Sections 1, 2, 3 and
 5 4, Resolution 35544.

6 BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF KING COUNTY:

7 SECTION 1. Section 42 (a) and (b), Resolution 28232 are
 8 amended to read as follows:

9 (a) There is hereby established a Boating Advisory Commission
 10 composed of such members as may be selected by the ((Board-of-King
 11 County-Commissioners)) County Executive and approved by the County
 12 Council.

13 (b) The Boating Advisory Commission shall recommend to the
 14 ((Board-of-King-County-Commissioners)) County Council ways and
 15 means for improving boating conditions. The Commission shall meet
 16 upon the call of the Chairman.

17 SECTION 2. Section 1, Resolution 35544 is amended to read
 18 as follows:

19 The ((~~chairman-of-the-board-of-county-commissioners, or-if-he~~
 20 ~~is-unavailable, any-other-available-commissioner~~)) county executive
 21 shall proclaim in writing the existence of a civil emergency, when
 22 it appears under existing circumstances that riot, unlawful assem-
 23 bly, insurrection, or the imminent threat thereof occur within the
 24 confines of King County and result in, or threaten to result in, the
 25 death or injury of persons, or the destruction of property to such
 26 extent as to require, in his judgment, extraordinary measures to
 27 protect the public peace, safety and welfare.

28 SECTION 3. Section 2, Resolution 35544 is amended to read
 29 as follows:

30 Upon the proclamation of a civil emergency by the ((~~chairman~~
 31 ~~of-the-board-of-county-commissioners, or-such-other-members-of-the~~
 32 ~~board-of-county-commissioners-as-may-be-available~~)) County
Executive and during the existence of such civil emergency, ((the
 chairman)) he may make and proclaim any or all of the following
 orders:

1 (a) An order imposing a general curfew applicable to the
2 county as a whole, or to such geographical area or areas of the
3 county as he deems necessary, and during such hours as he deems
4 necessary, and he may from time to time modify the area or areas
5 to which such a curfew shall apply, and the hours that such curfew
6 will be in effect;

7 (b) An order requiring any or all business establishments to
8 close and remain closed until further order;

9 (c) An order requiring the closure of any or all bars, taverns
10 liquor stores and other business establishments where alcoholic
11 beverages are sold or otherwise dispensed; provided that with
12 respect to those business establishments which are not primarily
13 devoted to the sale of alcoholic beverages, and in which such
14 alcoholic beverages may be removed or made secure from possible
15 seizure by the public, the portions thereof utilized for the sale
16 of items other than alcoholic beverages may, in his discretion, be
17 allowed to remain open;

18 (d) An order requiring the discontinuance of sale, distribution
19 or giving away of alcoholic beverages in any or all parts of the
20 county;

21 (e) An order requiring the closure of any or all business
22 establishments where firearms and/or ammunition for firearms are
23 sold or otherwise dispensed; provided that with respect to those
24 business establishments which are not primarily devoted to the sale
25 of firearms and/or ammunition and in which such firearms and/or ammu-
26 nition may be removed or made secure from possible seizure by the
27 public, the portions thereof utilized for the sale of items other
28 than firearms and/or ammunition may, in his discretion, be allowed
29 to remain open;

30 (f) An order requiring the discontinuance of the sale,
31 distribution or giving away of firearms and/or ammunition for
32 firearms in any or all parts of the county;

1 (g) An order prohibiting the carrying or possession of
2 firearms or any instrument which is capable of inducing bodily harm,
3 provided that any such order shall not apply to peace officers or
4 military personnel engaged in the performance of their official
5 duties;

6 (h) An order requiring the discontinuance of the sale,
7 distribution or giving away of gasoline or other liquid, flammable
8 or combustible products in any container (other than a gasoline
9 tank properly fixed to a motor vehicle);

10 (i) An order closing to the public any and all public places,
11 including streets, alleys, public ways, schools, parks, beaches,
12 amusement areas, and public buildings;

13 (j) Such other orders as are imminently necessary for the
14 protection of life and property.

15 SECTION 4. Section 3, Resolution 35544 is amended to read
16 as follows:

17 Any orders proclaimed pursuant to Section 2 above, shall, at
18 the earliest practicable time, be presented to the ((~~board-of-county~~
19 ~~commissioners~~)) County Council for ratification and confirmation
20 and if not so ratified and confirmed shall be void.

21 SECTION 5. Section 4, Resolution 35544 is amended to read
22 as follows:

23 The ((~~chairman-of-the-board-of-county-commissioners, or~~
24 ~~such-other-commissioner-as-shall-be-available,~~)) County Executive
25 shall cause any proclamation issued by him pursuant to the
26 authority of this chapter to be delivered to all news media within
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1 the county, and shall utilize such other available means, including
2 public address systems, as shall be necessary, in his judgement, to
3 give notice of such proclamations to the public.
