

ORDINANCE NO. 1872

AN ORDINANCE amending King County Ordinance 1438, Section 3(c), and K.C.C. 2.16.060, adding new sections, establishing a Department of Rehabilitative Services and creating a Board of Rehabilitative Services.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF KING COUNTY:

SECTION 1. Ordinance 1438, Section 3(c), and K.C.C.

2.16.060, is hereby amended to read as follows:

2.16.060 Department of Public Safety -- Duties -- Bureaus. The department of public safety shall be responsible for the enforcement of law and order, (~~the-administration-of-the-county-jail;~~) emergency preparedness and search and rescue. The department of public safety shall be composed of the following bureaus:

(1) BUREAU OF POLICE OPERATIONS. The bureau of police operations shall be responsible for the functions of police patrol, detectives, and marine patrol.

(2) BUREAU OF STAFF SERVICES. The bureau of staff services shall be responsible for the functions of communications, records and identification, personnel and training.

~~((3) BUREAU OF CORRECTIONS. The-bureau-of-corrections shall-be-responsible-for-the-administration-of-the-county-jail, rehabilitation-and-probation-and-parole-services. (Ord.-1438 §-3(e),-1972-))~~

SECTION 2. NEW SECTION. There is added to K.C.C. 2.16 a new section to read as follows:

Department of Rehabilitative Services -- Duties -- Divisions. The department of rehabilitative services shall be responsible for the administration of the divisions of involuntary treatment, detention, client services, and judicial services and shall include a research and evaluation function.

1 (a) INVOLUNTARY TREATMENT DIVISION. The involuntary
2 treatment division shall be responsible for the administration
3 of programs relating to the involuntary treatment and commitment
4 of the mentally ill.

5 (b) DETENTION DIVISION. The detention division shall
6 be responsible for the administration of criminal detention
7 facilities and work release programs.

8 (c) CLIENT SERVICES DIVISION. The client services
9 division shall be responsible for service contract development
10 and negotiation, pre-sentence diagnosis and reporting, and re-
11 habilitation services.

12 (d) JUDICIAL SERVICES DIVISION. The judicial
13 services division shall be responsible for pre-trial release in-
14 formation collection and post-sentence monitoring.

15 SECTION 3. NEW SECTION. There is added to K.C.C. 2.32 a
16 new section to read as follows:

17 There is established a Board of Rehabilitative Services herein-
18 after referred to as the Board consisting of thirteen members.
19 The members shall consist of the following or a designated
20 representative: The Chairman of the King County Magistrate's
21 Association, the Presiding Judge of the Seattle Municipal Court,
22 the Presiding Judge of the King County Superior Court, the Chair-
23 man of the Juvenile Court Management Committee, the Director of
24 the King County Department of Public Safety, the Administrator
25 of the King County Office of Public Defense, the King County
26 Prosecuting Attorney, the Mayor of the City of Seattle, the pres-
27 ident of the King County Suburban Mayors' Association, the Chief
28 of the Seattle Police Department, the Dean of the University of
29 Washington School of Law and the Dean of the University of
30 Washington School of Social Work. In addition the King County
31 Executive shall appoint one member who shall have been incar-
32 cerated in a King County detention facility within three years
33 prior to the appointment. The Director of the Department

1 of Rehabilitative Services shall serve as a non-voting ex-officio
2 member.

3 The Board shall serve as an advisory body to the Director
4 of the Department of Rehabilitative Services to review and make
5 recommendations at least annually for the Department on its
6 policies, operations and matters of budget.

7 The Director of the Department of Rehabilitative Services
8 shall be appointed by the County Executive from a list of at
9 least three names submitted by the Board of Rehabilitative
10 Services and shall be subject to the approval of the County
11 Council.

12 SECTION 4. NEW SECTION. This ordinance shall take effect
13 on January 1, 1974, except that Sections 1, 2(b), 2(c), and 2(d),
14 in order to provide for an orderly transfer of functions from
15 existing departments to the department created by this ordinance,
16 shall take effect on such date as is designated by the County
17 Executive by Executive Order, which date shall be not later than
18 July 1, 1974.

19 INTRODUCED AND READ for the first time this 26th day of
