ORDINANCE NO: 1924

AN ORDINANCE providing for rules and regulations to govern the use of King County parks; prescribing penalties; and repealing Ordinance No. 1007, Ordinance No. 545, Resolution No. 15273, Resolution No. 35917 and K.C.C. 7.04.010 through 7.04.030, 7.08.010 through 7.08.020; 7.12.010 through 7.12.120; 7.20.010 through 7.20.030.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF KING COUNTY:

SECTION 1. DEFINITIONS

DEFINITIONS: Whenever used in this Ordinance the following terms shall be defined as herein indicated:

- (a) "Division of Parks" shall mean the King County Department of Community and Environmental Development, Parks Division.
- (b) "Director" shall mean the Director of the Parks Division, King County Department of Community and Environmental Development.
- (c) "Caretaker/Custodian" shall mean a duly appointed King County Division of Parks employee.
- (d) "Person" shall mean all natural persons, firms, partner-ships, corporations, clubs and all associations or combination of persons whenever acting for themselves or by an agent, servant, or employee.
- (e) "Motor Vehicle" shall mean any self-propelled device capable of being moved upon a road, and in, upon, or by which any persons or property may be transported or drawn, and shall include, but not limited to, automobiles, trucks, motorcycles, motor scooters, jeeps or similar type 4-wheel drive vehicles, and snowmobiles, whether or not they can legally be operated upon the public highways.
- (f) "Trail" shall mean any path or track designed for use of pedestrians, bicycles, or equestrians; and which is not of sufficient width, nor graded or paved with concrete, asphalt, gravel, or similar substance, so as to permit its use by standard passenger automobiles; or other right-of-way

specifically designated and posted for non-vehicular use.

- (g) "Trailer" shall mean a towed vehicle which contains sleeping or housekeeping accommodations.
- (h) "Camper" shall mean a motorized vehicle containing sleeping and/or housekeeping accommodations, and shall include a pickup truck with camper, a van-type body, a converted bus, or any similar type vehicle.
- (i) "Trailer Site" shall mean designated camping sites which have water and/or electrical facilities available for hookup, and which are designed for the use of persons with trailers or campers.
- (j) "Camp Site" shall mean designated camping sites which are designated for the use of tent campers, and which have no water and/or electrical facilities available for hookup to a trailer or a camper.
- (k) "Camping" shall mean erecting a tent or shelter or arranging bedding, or both, for the purpose of, or in such a way as will permit remaining overnight, or parking a trailer, camper, or other vehicle for the purpose of remaining overnight.
- (1) "King County Park Area" shall mean any area under the ownership, management, or control of the Division of Parks.
- (m) "Associated Marine Area" shall mean any water area within one hundred feet of any "King County Park Area" or "Marine Facility" such as a dock, pier, float, buoy, log boom, or other such object which is part of a "King County Park Area", provided such area does not include private property.

SECTION 2. PROGRAM, PURPOSE

The playgrounds, activity centers, pools and other facilities of the Division of Parks of King County are established by law for public recreation purposes. The public recreation program consists primarily of activities planned and directed by the Division of Parks and secondarily of recreation activities of community groups brought under control of the Division when conducted under permit at the public park facility.

SECTION 3. ADMINISTRATION - HOURS

The Director shall establish for each King County Park Area according to existing conditions, times and periods when it will be open or closed to the public. Such times and periods shall be posted at the entrance to the King County Park Area affected and at the Park office. No person shall enter or be present at a King County Park Area after closing time except persons camping in a designated campsite or trailer site who have paid the applicable use fee.

SECTION 4. USE OF FACILITIES - PERMITS

- (a) Permits for Community Groups. Permits without charge may be granted by the Division to community groups to meet or conduct activities in the Division's buildings; provided the buildings are not otherwise required by the Division and the activities are:
 - 1. Conducted in accordance with the Division's standards.
 - 2. Held without admission charge.
 - 3. Not conducted for private voluntary gain.
 - 4. Open to the general public without discrimination.
 - 5. Scheduled during hours when the building is regularly open.

Applications for facilities cannot be reserved for more than thirty days in advance. A limited number of revocable permits will be issued to groups desiring the use of the facilities regularly on dates scheduled over the thirty day limit. All such permits must be approved by the Assistant Director for Recreation Services of the Division. King County swimming pools are excluded from the above provision.

(b) Special Permits. Groups which do not meet all of the requirements set forth in Section 4 (a) above and groups which desire the use of King County Swimming Pools may be granted special permits by the Division of Parks, but will be charged a fee. A schedule of the charges for special services in King

- (c) Cancellation of Permit. The Division reserves the right to cancel a permittee's meeting on any day that the Division wishes to make use of the facility and when there is a need of the facility which transcends the need of the permittee or for cause. Such notice shall be given at least twenty-four hours in advance.
- (d) Application Procedures. Application for the use of Division facilities by any group or individual shall be made through the Caretaker/Custodian of the Center, Pool or Park involved. In cases of installations without the services of a Caretaker/Custodian, the application shall be made by contacting the Assistant Director of Recreation Services at the Division Office.
- (e) Religious Services or Group Rallies. Religious services or group rallies may be permitted in King County Park Areas where facilities are adequate, and where such activities will not conflict in any way with normal park usage. To avoid conflict, permission for such activities must be obtained in advance from the Director. Permission for the use of loudspeakers by groups must be obtained in advance.

SECTION 5. USE OF FACILITIES - BUILDING USE HOURS

Activities for groups using the facilities Sundays through

Thursdays shall normally cease at 10:00 p.m. unless otherwise
stated on the permit. Friday and Saturday groups must agree to
be out of the facility by 12:30 a.m. unless otherwise stated on
the permit.

SECTION 6. USE OF FACILITIES - RULES AND REGULATIONS

- Cleanup. All groups must leave the facility in a (a) condition considered satisfactory to the Caretaker/Custodian in charge who will supervise cleanup activity. No group shall conduct activities causing extra custodial work unless previous agreement has been made to pay for such work.
- Liability. Groups using facilities will be required to protect and save King County, its elected and appointed officials and employees while acting within the scope of their duties as such, harmless from and against all claims, demands, and causes of action of any kind or character, including the cost of defense thereof, arising in favor of group's employees or third parties on account of personal injuries, death or damage to property arising out of the premises.
- Liability Insurance. Groups using facilities shall obtain and maintain continuously public liability insurance and/ or other insurance necessary to protect the public on premises leased, with limits of liability not less than:

\$100,000.00 each person personal injury \$300,000.00 each occurrence personal injury \$ 25,000.00 each occurrence property damage

- (d) Adults to Accompany Minors. At all assemblies of minors responsible adults must be present throughout the entire function.
- (e) Storage of Equipment. Liability of County. Groups using facilities should not expect storage space for equipment necessary for their program. If temporary storage is provided, King County cannot be held responsible for loss through theft or fire. King County insurance covers county-owned equipment only.
- Contract to Use for Private Profit. Community organizations and individuals are not allowed to establish regular charges for equipment services at concessions at a park facility. The use of public facilities for private gain is

allowed only through concession contracts by the County competitive bidding procedures.

(g) Failure to Perform. The misuse of a park facility or the failure to conform with these regulations will be sufficient reason for denying any future application.

SECTION 7. MOTOR VEHICLES - PARKING

No operator of any automobile, trailer, camper, boat trailer, or other vehicle, shall park such vehicle in any King County Park Area, except where the operator is using the area for a designated recreational purpose and the vehicle is parked either in a designated parking area, or in another area with the permission of a Caretaker/Custodian. No person shall park, leave standing, or abandon a vehicle in any King County Park Area after closing time, except when camping in a designated area, or with permission from the Caretaker/Custodian. Any vehicle found parked in violation of this section may be towed away at the owner's or operator's expense.

SECTION 8. MOTOR VEHICLES ON ROADS AND TRAILS

No person shall operate any motor vehicle on a trail in any King County Park Area unless such trail has been specifically designated and posted for such use. Subject to the provisions of this section, no person shall operate a motor vehicle within the boundaries of a King County Park Area except on roads, streets, highways, parking lots, or parking areas; provided that traveling upon such roads, streets, highways, parking lots, or parking areas has not been prohibited by proper posting.

SECTION 9. MOTOR VEHICLES - SPEED LIMITS

No person shall drive a motor vehicle within any King County

Park area at a speed greater than is reasonable and prudent,

having due regard for the traffic on, and the surface and width

of the road, and in no event at a speed which endangers the safety of persons, property, or wildlife; provided, however, that in no event shall a vehicle be driven at a speed greater than fifteen miles per hour in camp, picnic, utility, or headquarters areas, or in areas of general public assemblage; and provided further than in no event shall a vehicle be driven at a speed greater than twenty-five miles per hour in any other area. The Division of Parks, however, upon finding that the safety of persons and the condition of the road and the traffic thereon so warrants, may establish lower speed limits and shall post the same in the area where so established.

SECTION 10. MOTOR VEHICLES IN SNOW AREAS

All vehicles operating upon roads within the boundaries of any King County Park Area when such roads are covered with snow or ice, and so posted, shall be equipped with approved snow tires or chains.

SECTION 11. MOTOR VEHICLES - TRUCKS AND COMMERCIAL VEHICLES

No person shall cause a truck or other vehicle while being

used for commercial purposes to enter upon, use, or traverse any

portion of any King County Park Area or any park road therein

except in the service of the Division of Parks at the request of

the employees of the Division of Parks, or by express permission

of the Director for a special activity not inconsistent with

King County Park use; PROVIDED THAT, the provisions of this

section shall not apply to County Roads or State Highways.

SECTION 12. AIRCRAFT

(a) Aircraft Landing. No aircraft shall land on or take off from any body of water or land area in a King County Park Area not specifically designated for landing aircraft.

- (b) Model Aircraft and Rockets.
- (1) No one shall fly rockets or model aircraft in any King County Park Area except in areas specifically designated and/or posted for that purpose.
- (2) All engines over .25 CI used in model aircraft being flown in designated King County Park Areas shall be muffled.
- (3) All persons flying model aircraft in designated King County Park Areas shall abide by the Official AMA Safety Code.
- (4) All persons desiring to shoot model rockets in a King County Park Area shall obtain a permit to do so from the Park Caretaker/Custodian, or in a park where there is no Caretaker/Custodian, from the Assistant Director for Recreation Services at the Division Office.

SECTION 13. BOATING - USE OF MARINE AREAS AND FACILITIES

- (a) Occupancy Policy. In order to afford the general public the greatest possible use of such marine facilities, continuous occupancy by the same person or persons of marine facilities in any area is limited to thirty-six hours. Shorter limitation of occupancy may be established and posted by the King County Division of Parks at any individual facility or area.
- (b) Commercial Craft Prohibited. Use of these marine areas and marine facilities by commercial craft is prohibited. For the purpose of this rule "commercial craft" shall mean craft used for any commercial purpose but shall not include a commercial craft operated within the terms of a concession lease with the Division of Parks.
- (c) Overnight Moorage. No person or persons shall moor, anchor, dock or berth a boat or other object overnight in a King County Park Area or Associated Marine Area unless area has been

designated for such use by the Division of Parks.

- (d) Tandem Moorage. No more than three boats or other objects may be tied or rafted together when moored, docked or berthed adjacent to a dock, pier or float in a King County Park Area or Associated Marine Area.
- (e) Moorage in Swimming Area Prohibited. No person or persons shall moor, dock, or berth a boat or other object to a log boom or float line which delineates a swimming area in a King County Park Area or Associated Marine Area.

SECTION 14. USE OF MARINE HEADS

No person shall use/or flush any marine head which when flushed emits its contents directly into the waters of a lake, river, Puget Sound, or any other water area, nor shall cause any human or animal waste to be dumped into said waters while moored, anchored, docked or berthed in a King County Park Area or Associated Marine Area or when entering or leaving such area.

SECTION 15. CAMPING

- (a) In Designated Areas Only. No person shall camp in any King County Park Area except in areas specifically designated and/or marked for that purpose.
- (b) Occupancy Policy. In order to afford the general public the greatest possible use of the King County Park System, on a fair and equal basis, continuous occupancy of camping facilities by the same person shall be limited to seven (7) days. Shorter limitation of occupancy may be established and posted by the King County Division of Parks at any individual facility or area.
- (c) Occupancy Number of Vehicles. The number of vehicles occupying camping facilities shall be limited to one car or one camper, or one vehicle with trailer, per camp or trailer site.

A greater number may be authorized in specific areas when constructed facilities so warrant.

- (d) Fees. Fees for the use of campsites or trailer sites are due and payable daily. The daily fee covers use of facilities until the vacating time of 3:00 p.m. of the following day.
- (e) Occupancy Hours. Occupants shall vacate camping facilities by removing their personal property therefrom prior to 3:00 p.m. if applicable use fee has not been paid or if time limit for occupancy of the campsite has expired. The occupants may, however, remain in other areas of the park for purposes other than camping until normal closing time of the Park. Remaining overtime shall subject the occupant to the payment of additional use fee.
- (f) Use of Trailer Sites by Tent Campers. No tent camper shall be allowed to occupy a designated trailer site except as directed by a Caretaker/Custodian. Use of trailer sites by tent campers shall be subject to payment of the trailer site fee.
- (g) Sites Considered Occupied When Paid For. A trailer site or campsite is considered occupied when it is being used for purposes of camping by a person or persons who have paid the daily use fee within the applicable time limits. No person shall take or attempt to take possession of a campsite or trailer site when it is being occupied by another party or when informed by a Caretaker/Custodian that such campsite or trailer site is occupied.

SECTION 16. SWIMMING

- (a) In Designated Areas Only. Swimming areas in King County Park Areas are marked with buoys, log booms, or other markers, clearly designating the boundaries of such areas. Swimming shall be permitted only within these areas.
- (b) Swimmers Must Obey Rules. All persons using any designated swimming area shall obey all posted beach rules and/or the instructions of lifeguards, Caretakers/Custodians, or other Park Division Employees.
- (c) Swimming in Boat Launch Areas Prohibited. No person shall swim or sunbathe in any designated boat launching area.
- (d) False Alarm of Drowning Prohibited. No person shall give or transmit a false signal or false alarm of drowning in any manner.

SECTION 17. FISHING

- (a) Game Fish. All laws, rules and regulations of the State Game Commission relating to season, limits, and methods of fishing are applicable to fishing for game fish in King County Park Areas. No person may fish for, or possess any fish taken from any dam, dike, bridge, dock, boatlanding, or beach, which is posted with a sign prohibiting fishing.
- (b) Shellfish and Food Fish. All laws, rules and regulations of the State Department of Fisheries relating to season, limits, and methods of taking, are applicable to the taking of shellfish or food fish in King County Park Areas, except that in addition to such laws, the King County Park System may, upon its finding and for good cause, close certain King County Park Areas for specific periods of time, to the taking of shellfish. Such closed areas shall be posted with appropriate signs.

SECTION 18. PICNICKING

Picnicking is permitted only in designated and marked picnicking areas, or in such other places within a King County Park Area as may from time to time be designated by a Caretaker/

SECTION 19. TENTS, ETC., ON BEACHES

No person shall erect, maintain, use or occupy temporary tent or shelter on any swimming beach in any King County Park Area unless there is an unobstructed view through such tent or shelter from at least two sides; provided, however, that nothing herein contained shall be construed to authorize camping except in designated areas.

SECTION 20. DISROBING

- (a) No person shall disrobe in public in any King County Park Area.
- (b) Clothing sufficient to conform to community standards shall be worn at all times.

SECTION 21. GAMES ON BEACHES

Playing games and general horseplay on crowded swimming beaches is prohibited. At times large uncrowded beach areas can safely permit some games. Such games will be permitted only with the consent of a Caretaker/Custodian, Lifeguard, or other Division of Parks employee.

SECTION 22. PETS

- (a) Must be Kept on Leash. All dogs or other pets or domestic animals must be kept on leash no greater than eight (8) feet in length, and under control at all times while in a King County Park Area.
- (b) Prohibited on Beaches and in Buildings. Dogs, pets or domestic animals are not permitted on any designated swimming beach in any King County Park Area, nor in any public building unlessed posted; PROVIDED THAT, this subsection shall not apply to seeing eye dogs.
- (c) Disturbances by Animals Prohibited. No person shall allow his dog or other pet or domestic animal to bite or in any way molest or annoy other park visitors. No person shall permit his dog or other pet or domestic animal to bark continuously or

otherwise disturb the peace and tranquility of the park.

SECTION 23. HORSEBACK RIDING

- (a) In Designated Areas Only. No horses shall be permitted in any King County Park Area, except where designated and posted to specifically permit such activity. Horses shall not be permitted on any designated swimming area, campground or picnic area.
- (b) May Not Endanger Others. No person shall ride any horse or other animal in such a manner that might endanger life or limb of any person or animal, and no person shall allow horse or other animal to stand unattended or insecurely tied.

SECTION 24. DAMAGE TO PROPERTY

No person shall cut down, destroy, or in any way injure any shrub, tree, vine, grain, grass or crop, standing or growing or which has been cut down, in any King County Park Area.

SECTION 25. SANITATION

- (a) Rubbish. No person shall leave, deposit, drop or scatter bottles, broken glass, ashes, waste paper, cans, or other rubbish, in a King County Park Area, except in a garbage can or other receptacle designated for such purposes.
- (b) Outside Household or Commercial Waste. No person shall deposit any household or commercial garbage, refuse, waste, or rubbish, which is brought as such from any private property, in any King County Park Area garbage can or other receptacle designated for such purpose.
- (c) Waste From Vehicles. No person shall, in any King County Park Area, drain or dump refuse or waste from any trailer, camper, automobile, or other vehicle, except in designated disposal areas or receptacles.
- (d) Food Waste, Washing of Clothes or Animals. No person shall clean fish or other food, or wash any clothing or other articles for personal or household use, or any dog or other

animal, except at designated areas in any King County Park Area.

- (e) Washing of Vehicles. No person shall clean or wash any automobile or other vehicle in any King County Park Area except in areas specifically for that use.
- Dumping in Water Prohibited. No person shall pollute, (f) or in any way contaminate by dumping or otherwise depositing therein any waste or refuse of any nature, kind or description, including human or bodily waste, any stream, river, lake or other body of water running in, through, or adjacent to any King County Park Area.

SECTION 26. SOLICITATION

No person shall solicit, sell, or peddle any goods, wares, merchandise, liquids, or edibles for human consumption, or distribute or post any handbills, circulars, or signs, or use any loudspeakers or other amplifying device, in any King County Park Area, except by concession granted by the Division of Parks.

SECTION 27. FIREWORKS

No person shall possess, discharge, set off, or cause to be discharged, in or into any King County Park Area, any firecracker, torpedoes, rockets, fireworks, explosives, or substance harmful to the life or safety of persons or property.

FIREARMS, WEAPONS SECTION 28.

No person shall possess a firearm with a cartridge in any portion of the mechanism; nor shall any person discharge across, in, or into any King County Park Area a firearm, bow and arrow, or air or gas weapon, or any device capable of injuring or killing any person or animal, or damaging or destroying any public or private property, except where the Division of Parks for good cause has authorized a special recreational activity

upon finding that it is not inconsistent with King County Park use.

SECTION 29. ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES

The opening and/or consumption of alcoholic beverages in a
King County Park Area and/or Associated Marine Area is prohibited
and violators will be prosecuted on misdemeanor charges.

SECTION 30. PENALTIES; ENFORCEMENT

Every person who willfully violates any of the provisions of this ordinance shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and shall, upon conviction, be punished by a fine of not more than Two Hundred and Fifty Dollars (\$250.00), or by imprisonment in a County Jail for not more than ninety (90) days. In addition, every person failing to comply with any provision of this ordinance shall be subject to immediate ejection from the King County Park Area or Associated Marine Area. The King County Director of Public Safety and Division of Parks employees are authorized and directed to enforce the provisions of this ordinance.
