

ORDINANCE NO. 2160

AN ORDINANCE relating to placing Referendum Measure No. 1 (1974), King County Ordinance No. 1975, regulating the dress of female employees in places open to the public wherein alcoholic beverages are served and prescribing penalties, on the ballot of the November 5, 1974, county-wide election.

PREAMBLE:

The Superintendent of Elections has examined and certified the sufficiency of the signatures in support of Referendum Measure No. 1 (1974), and on July 15, 1974, the King County Council in a regular meeting unanimously accepted the Certification of Sufficiency.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF KING COUNTY:

SECTION 1. Referendum Measure No. 1 (1974) on King County Ordinance No. 1975 shall be placed on the ballot of the county-wide election on November 5, 1974, in the following form:
