

ORDINANCE NO. 2469

1 AN ORDINANCE appropriating \$1,957,004 to the fiscal
2 year 1975-76 CETA Title II Fund, and appropriating
3 \$4,514,237 to the CETA Title VI Fund, establishing
4 a new fund and adding a new section to Ordinance
5 No. 2230.

6 PREAMBLE:

7 \$6,471,241 has been made available to King County through June 30, 1976
8 by the United States Department of Labor through King/Snohomish Manpower
9 Consortium; \$1,957,004 under CETA Title II and \$4,514,237 under CETA
10 Title VI.

11 BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF KING COUNTY:

12 Section 1. A new fund is hereby created, entitled Fiscal Year 1975-76
13 CETA Title II fund to receive and disburse funds received under Title II.

14 Section 2. An amount of \$1,957,004 is hereby appropriated to the Fiscal
15 Year 1975-76 CETA Title II fund and allocated to:

16 King County Government, including non-profit agencies	\$1,092,318
17 Other Public Agencies	685,836
18 CETA Administration Support	178,850

19 And an amount of \$4,514,237 is appropriated to the existing CETA Title VI
20 fund and allocated to:

21 School Districts	\$2,115,556
22 Cities and Towns	1,118,368
23 CETA Administration, Support	51,150
24 King County Government	1,229,163
25	<u>\$4,514,237</u>

26 PROVIDED THAT:

- 27 1. Following completion of specified activities, the Executive shall
28 recommend for Council approval by motion, no later than October 15, 1975,
29 CETA positions which should be funded effective January 1, 1976.
- 30 2. Requests for continuation of CETA public agency positions, currently
31 funded through December 31, 1975, or requests for new positions
32 thereafter shall be evaluated against the following criteria presented in
33 their order of importance:
 - 34 A. Commitment by the applicant agency to absorb the qualified employee,
35 ideally at the end of the federal fiscal year, based on a logical
36 discussion of normal attrition in the agency leading to identify
37 local revenue supported position vacancies.
 - 38 B. Agency prioritized need.
 - 39 C. Suitability to both long-term and recent unemployed.
 - 40 D. Transition potential.
 - 41 E. Preference to types of positions normally funded over limited term
42 project positions.

1 F. Service to economically disadvantaged or unemployed.

- 2 3. The Executive shall recommend for Council approval by motion, no later
3 than September 15, 1975 a priority listing of geographical areas in King
4 County according to level of unemployment and numbers of welfare
5 recipients, the recommendation to be supported by statistical analysis.
6
7 4. Funds to support non-profit positions after January 1, 1976 shall be
8 allocated by formula to public agencies which will distribute funds based
9 on identified jurisdictional needs. This formula shall be developed by
10 the Executive and presented to Council by September 15, 1975 for adoption
11 by motion.
12
13 5. Continuation of the \$1,092,000 allocation to non-profit corporations for
14 CETA positions past December 31, 1975 and the funding of new CETA
15 positions thereafter shall be evaluated against the following criteria
16 presented in their order of importance:
17
18 A. The applicant has identified preferably by statutory reference that
19 the service to be provided is a responsibility of local government
20 within King County.
21
22 B. Service will benefit the unemployed and/or economically disadvantaged.
23
24 C. Service by the applicant agency will be provided to an identified
25 area in King County, and expressed in terms of the number of clients
26 to be served from the proposed service area.
27
28 D. Commitment to attempt to hire a resident of the identified service
29 area and a member of the identified significant segments of the
30 population established by the King-Snohomish Manpower Consortium.
31
32 E. Transition potential of the position.
33
34 F. Applicant's previous participation.
35
36 G. Direct service position.
37
38 6. No funds shall be expended for training purposes until a detailed
39 training plan has been approved by Motion of the Council.
40
41 7. Funds allocated to County departments for County-sponsored CETA positions
42 shall be expended, beyond September 30, 1975, only as directed by Council
43 Motion setting forth any changes, if any, from the initial schedule
44 attached hereto.

45 Section 3. The individual positions authorized from these appropriations
46 are listed in Attachments I & II.

47 Section 4. The following new section is hereby added to Ordinance No. 2230:

48 NEW SECTION. SECTION 89. Fiscal Year 1975-76 CETA Title II -

49 From the Fiscal Year 1975-76 CETA Title II fund there is hereby appropriated:

50 \$1,975,004

51 Section 5. Section 87 of Ordinance No. 2230 is amended to read as follows:

5 All provisos adopted by the Council in Ordinance No. 2230, as amended, shall

POSITION

Extra Help	\$20,000	Necessary to accelerate the collection of Real Estate Commercial and Industrial improvement characteristics data in King County to enable the Assessor to conclude this data collection program by June 30, 1976.
4) Building Inspector Aides	\$ 5,088 ea.	These positions, under Housing & Community Development, were created to reduce the cost of administration, thereby permitting more of the \$1.5 million Community Development Block Grant to be used for projects.
4) General Inspector I's	\$ 6,000 ea.	These new positions are needed to support the building inspection function. Building permit and inspection activity has experienced a phenomenal increase during the first half of this year. This position will be utilized to keep pace with this increased workload (including reducing the backlog of inspections).
Adm. Asst. I	\$ 6,000	This position is an integral part of the Division's staff in the area of financial administration and personnel. Responsibilities include developing and maintaining procedures to claim and invoice all revenue sources; personnel and payroll administration; develop internal procedures in requisition, receiving, payment and receipt of all items.
0) Drivers	\$ 4,122 ea.	The transportation component of the Alcoholism Detoxification Program, required by Senate Bill 29, is staffed entirely by CETA personnel. This is a 24 hour, seven day a week service. During a month, 800+ individuals are transported and processed for alcoholism intoxicification. The drivers also assist staff members at Harborview Medical Center and the Alcoholism Treatment Facility in caring for the sick alcoholic while awaiting treatment.
6) Positions	\$31,740	
Admin. Aide	\$ 5,616	This position is working solely with the Surface Water Task Force. The Task Force initiated operation in March and is scheduled to complete a work program and formulate recommendations on potential solutions for Surface Water problems by April 1, 1976. The Administrative Aide working with this program is actively involved with the Work program; it is therefore recommended that the position be continued until the projected completion of the project in April, 1976.

<u>POSITION</u>	<u>CETA CONTRIBUTION SIX MONTHS</u>	<u>JUSTIFICATION</u>
Adm. Asst. I	\$ 6,000	This position currently serves in the function of contract compliance. It is housed in the office of the King County Contract Compliance Officer. Currently, there are 21 C.I.P. projects in addition to the Stadium which require contract compliance review. This position also reviews County supplies and goods service contract awards for EEOC compliance.
(5) Correction Officers	\$ 6,000 ea.	Responsible for jail operations on a 24 hour, seven day a week basis, including booking and releasing, security maintenance in cell areas, supervising recreation, ingress and egress to the jails. These positions were in lieu of current expense position.
(2) Security Aides	\$ 6,000 ea.	Responsible for routine work in the jail kitchens, laundry and clothing rooms and jail commissary. These positions were in lieu of current expense positions.
Work Release Attendant	\$ 5,904	Responsible for maintaining security in the men's Work Release Unit, approximately 60 inmates. This position was in lieu of a current expense position.
Social Worker	\$ 3,960	Performs preliminary psycho-social evaluation of inmates appearing to need mental health services, participates in case staffings, performs various counseling functions, and provides training and supervision to student interns and para-professionals. This position was allowed in recognition of the emergent need to provide basic mental health services in the Jail.
Adm. Asst. I	\$ 5,616	The Administrative Assistant I monitors State and Federal legislation, analyzes bills that impact the County, prepares issue papers on proposed legislation and status reports for the Department head. The AAI reviews Federal and State regulations, informing departments involved, and participates in a continuing search for grant funds for County projects. In addition, the Administrative Assistant performs staff functions for various committees.

<u>POSITION</u>	<u>CETA CONTRIBUTION SIX MONTHS</u>	<u>JUSTIFICATION</u>
Evaluation Technician	\$ 5,616	Assists County Departments and outside agencies that administer grant programs sponsored by King County in developing measurable goals and objectives and establishing evaluation components for their programs. The Evaluation Technician participates in the actual evaluation of County-sponsored grants and makes recommendations for improving project performance and reporting procedures.
Adm. Asst. I	\$ 6,000	During the first six months of 1975, this position was used in assisting the development of a financial reporting system relative to service agencies. For the next six months, the position will continue to be used in the Financial Management Section to continue developing the financial reporting system; to correlate the financial section in the development of the Consolidated Reporting System; to review and improve agency accounting/budgeting procedures; and to assist in the development of the financial section's goals and objectives for the total Divisional plan.
SS Program Analyst	\$ 6,000	During the first six months of 1975, this position was used in assisting in the preparation of the 1976 Drug Abuse Plan. For the next six months, this position would be used for development of project descriptions based upon priorities in the 1976 Drug Abuse Plan; preparation of work plans and assisting in implementation of such plans; continuation of key person survey in King County with analysis of collected data being performed; and, conducting semi-annual management reviews in twenty drug agencies.
(5) SS Program Analysts	\$ 6,000	During the first six months of 1975, these positions (except one vacant position) were used in the newly formed Monitoring and Evaluation Section within the Division in conducting needs assessment work for the Mental Health Plan and overall Divisional plan. These positions for the next six months will continue working in the M & E section to continue conducting needs assessment projects; to design and administer specific evaluation studies relative to the categorical plans; to develop program definitions and standards; to develop goals and objectives and related measurement criteria; and, to develop input/output processes for the Consolidated Reporting System.

Office Asst. III	\$ 4,494	Position established in CETA in lieu of regular County position. Provides clerical support in investigation when there has been a 30% increase in clerical duties.
Office Asst. III	\$ 4,494	Position established in CETA in lieu of regular County position. Provides clerical support in Recreation and Special Services.
Office Asst. III	\$ 4,494	Position established in CETA in lieu of regular County position. Provides clerical support in the volunteer program.
(2) Planner III Planner II	\$ 6,000 \$ 6,000 ea.	These positions, under Housing and Community Development, were created to reduce the cost of administration, thereby permitting more of the \$1.5 million Community Development Block Grant to be used for projects.

(3) Utility Workers	\$ 6,000 ea.	Without this support the King County Parks would be maintained less than adequately given the new additional acreage in 1975.
(4) Park Caretakers	\$ 6,000 ea.	Without this support the King County Parks would be maintained less than adequately given the new additional acreage in 1975.
(2) Pool Operators	\$ 6,000 ea.	Required for maintenance of the Mercer Island and Federal Way pools. Without this support the pool system would not be maintained adequately either on a day to day basis or on a preventative maintenance basis to keep the pool open.
Extra Help	\$10,800	The carryover of \$15,000 in unexpended Extra Help funds into the second six months will enable the Division to maintain their present Extra Help staff for these peak activity summer months.
