ORDINANCE NO.

1 AN ORDINANCE relating to requiring Comprehensive Plans
2 for water and sewer districts; and amending Ordinance
3 No. 1709, Section 1, and K.C.C. 13.24.010, and
4 declaring an emergency.

5 BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF KING COUNTY:

6 SECTION 1. Ordinance No. 1709, Section 1, and K.C.C. 13.24.010 are
7 hereby amended as follows:

8 DISTRICT COMPREHENSIVE PLANS. Comprehensive plans for water and sewer
9 districts and entities which distribute water in unincorporated areas of King
10 County, Washington, shall be adopted by each such district or distributor and
11 approved by the King County Council as a prerequisite for the granting of new
12 right-of-way franchises and right-of-way construction permits and right-of-way
13 franchise renewals. Such plans shall be approved by the Director of the
14 Department of Public Works and Transportation, the Director of the Seattle-King
15 County Department of Public Health, and reviewed by a utilities technical
16 review committee established by this ordinance, prior to submission to the
17 King County Council for approval. PROVIDED THAT sewer and water district and
18 water distributor comprehensive plans approved by the County prior to July
19 1, 1973, will not require further approval for the purposes of this ordinance
20 until (~~July 1, 1976~~) December 30, 1976.

21 SECTION 2. The County Council finds as a fact and declares that an
22 emergency exists and that this ordinance is necessary for the immediate pre-
23 servation of public peace, health or safety or for the support of county
24 government and its existing public institutions.
