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ORDINANCE NO. _____

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AN ORDINANCE relating to Rules and Order of Business of the King County Council, amending Ordinance 2347, Section 1, Ordinance 1420, Section 2, Ordinance 1482, Section 1, Ordinance 1373, Section 17, and KCC 1.24.170; and Ordinance 1987, Section 4, Ordinance 1373, Section 4, and KCC 1.24.040.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF KING COUNTY:

SECTION 1. Ordinance 2347, Section 1, Ordinance 1420, Section 2, Ordinance 1482, Section 1, Ordinance 1373, Section 17, and KCC 1.24.170 are hereby amended as follows:

Standing Committees. The chairman of the council shall appoint the chairman, vice chairman and the membership of the standing committees, with consent of a majority of the councilmembers.

The standing committees are established as follows:

(1) Health and Human Services - ((Four)) Three or More Members. Function: to consider and make recommendations on all matters relating to health, welfare and human resource programs of the county including human service functional planning and programming.

(2) Planning and Community Development - ((Five)) Three or More Members. Function: to consider and make recommendations on all matters pertaining to comprehensive planning within the county including long-range and community plans, functional plans for housing, parks and recreation, transportation, economic development, shoreline management, open space, air and water quality. ((to-consider-and-report-on-all-matters-pertaining-to zoning-and-other-land-use-development-controls:))

(3) Finance ((;Audit)) and Budget - ((Four)) Three or More Members. Function: to recommend budget objectives and priorities and schedule for the Council's review of the yearly Executive budget proposal; to consider and make recommendations on all matters and legislation of a financial nature, including appropriations, expenditures, the selling of bonds and

1 investment policies; and on all matters relating to the levying
 2 of taxes; to investigate and report on all financial claims filed
 3 against the county; and to examine requests for changes in
 4 assessments and taxes (~~(; -to receive and examine reports of the~~
 5 ~~County and State Auditor and submit such recommendations to the~~
 6 ~~County Council as it deems necessary or desirable in connection~~
 7 ~~with the subject matter of such reports; and coordinate Council~~
 8 ~~overview of the economy, efficiency and effectiveness of all~~
 9 ~~County departments and programs)).~~

10 (4) Inter-Governmental Relations - (~~Four~~) Three or More
 11 Members. Function: to consider and make recommendations on all
 12 matters of joint interest between the County and (a) other
 13 counties, the state of Washington and the federal government,
 14 (b) the city of Seattle and other towns and municipalities within
 15 the county, and (c) other government agencies such as Metro, the
 16 Puget Sound Council of Governments and Central Puget Sound
 17 Economic Development District.

18 (5) Operations, Police and Judiciary - (~~Four~~) Three or
 19 More Members. Function: to consider and make recommendations on
 20 matters relating to county personnel (~~and governmental organiza-~~
 21 ~~tion)); to oversee and receive reports from the Office of~~
 22 Citizens' Complaints; to consider and make recommendations on all
 23 matters relating to County records and elections; to consider
 24 and make recommendations on all matters relating to amendment of
 25 the County Charter; to consider and make recommendations on all
 26 matters relating to the criminal justice system, including law,
 27 safety, and justice, functional planning and programming.

28 (6) Public Facilities and Utilities - (~~Four~~) Three or
 29 More Members. Function: to consider and make recommendations
 30 on all matters relating to the construction and maintenance of
 31 the County road and park system, and on all matters concerning
 32 public facilities, solid waste, surface water, fire protection
 33 and utilities, including public facilities and utilities; to

1 consider and make recommendations on all matters concerning
2 building permits building codes and other technical codes and
3 regulations.

4 (7) Personnel - ((Five)) Three or More Members, to be
5 chaired by the Council Chairman. The composition of the committee
6 shall be reflective of the Council. Function: to implement
7 Council personnel policy and make recommendations on matters
8 relating to legislative branch organization and personnel,
9 including but not limited to, screening processes, employment
10 practices, performance evaluation, reporting relationships,
11 salary levels, incentive programs, vacation and leave practices,
12 levels of employment, new positions, employees and employees'
13 contracts and departmental or office organization.

14 No new positions shall be created during any budget year
15 without approval of the majority of the Council. Any
16 consultation fee above five thousand dollars shall be approved
17 by the Council.

18 (8) Audit - Three or More Members. Function: to receive
19 and examine reports of the County and State Auditor and submit
20 such recommendations to the County Council as it deems necessary
21 or desirable in connection with the subject matter of such
22 reports; coordinate Council overview of the economy, efficiency
23 and effectiveness of all county departments and programs; and to
24 review proposed work programs of the County Auditor and make
25 recommendations thereon to the County Council.

26 (9) Government Organization - Three or More Members.
27 Function: to consider and make recommendations to the County
28 Council on matters relating to the organizational structure of
29 county government.

30 (10) Land Use Appeals - Two committees each consisting of
31 three or more members. Function: to consider and report upon
32 appeals from recommendations of the Office of Zoning and
33 Subdivision Examiner.

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SECTION 2. Ordinance 1987, Section 4, Ordinance 1373,
Section 4 and KCC 1.24.040 are hereby amended as follows:

Agenda Business shall be disposed of in the following order:

- (1) Roll Call;
- (2) Approval of minutes;
- (3) Special items;
- (4) Introduction of ordinances for first reading;
- (5) Hearings and second readings of ordinances;
- (6) Motions and memorials for council action;
- (7) Reports of standing committees, zoning appeal panels
and the zoning and subdivision examiner;
- (8) Motions and memorials referred to committee;
- (9) Extra items;
- (10) Other business.
