

ORDINANCE NO. 3104

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AN ORDINANCE appropriating \$86,872 to the Department of Public Safety for installation of a countywide radio emergency alerting system; and amending Ordinance 2988, Section 26, as amended.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF KING COUNTY:

SECTION 1. An appropriation of \$86,872 to the Department of Public Safety is hereby approved and adopted: \$32,491 from the Executive Contingency in Special Programs and \$54,381 from future federal reimbursements. The Department of Public Safety shall install a countywide radio alerting system, establish an emergency direction and control communications system for county executive departments responsible for providing emergency services during disasters, and is given authority through subgrant agreement, to allocate \$19,889 of federal reimbursables to the City of Bellevue for the installation of communication equipment as specified in the approved grant application.

SECTION 2. Ordinance 2988, Section 26, is hereby amended to read as follows:

SECTION 26: Public Safety - From the Current Expense Fund there is hereby appropriated to:

Public Safety	((\$11,612,010))	<u>\$11,698,882</u>
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PROVIDED THAT:

- 1) Effective January 1, 1977, police officer positions budgeted in Public Safety and permanently vacated for reasons of permanent medical disability or for other reasons shall be filled by police officers presently assigned to jail security; and police officers leaving the jail shall be replaced by civilian corrections officers.
- 2) At least two positions filled by police officers shall be used to implement two K-9 Corp units in King County; no more than \$30,000 exclusive of personnel costs shall be used in support of the K-9 units.
- 3) No later than March 15, 1977, the Department shall present to the Operations, Police and Judiciary Committee a study defining alternatives by which Civil Process procedures can be altered to allow transfer of commissioned officers from that activity to other field activities. The intent of the Council is that police officers should only perform those functions which

2 4) The \$5,000 budgeted in the Policy Direction element as
3 contingency reserve is deleted.

4 5) No later than April 15, 1977, the department shall
5 present to the Operations, Police and Judiciary
6 Committee for review and action a detailed work program,
7 containing policy goals and measurable objectives,
8 substantiating the purposes and uses of personnel and
9 resources allocated to the Uniformed Patrol Operations
10 element. The report shall include a program for
11 increasing the number of patrol districts and the
12 number of patrol officers.

13 6) A. The following positions are deleted:

- 14 (1) Policy Direction, one police officer
15 (~~((2))--Fiscal-and-Property-Management,-one-police~~
16 ~~officer~~)
17 (~~((3))--Communications,-two-sergeants~~)
18 (~~((4))~~) (3) Civil Process Service, (~~((four))~~) two
19 police officers
20 (~~((5))--Inspectional-Services,-one-sergeant~~)

21 B. The following positions are added:

- 22 (1) Uniformed Patrol Operations, 11 police
23 officers and three sergeants

24 These positions shall be assigned to field
25 patrol only.

26 7) In 1977 there shall be no more than two police officer
27 positions assigned to the Personnel and Training
28 Element; one to provide security to the Executive and
29 one to serve as the firing range officer. The present
30 police officer directing training is to continue in
31 that capacity until the April 15, 1977, report.

32 8) With the exception of precinct patrol sergeants and
33 ranking personnel, all sergeants assigned to individual
precincts shall be assigned field supervisory
responsibilities.

9) By March 15, 1977, the Executive shall present
recommendations for the future funding and
organizational status of the Youth Offender Project to
become effective in May, 1977.

10) In the event that it is determined that the employment
status of the transferred radio maintenance employees
is jeopardized, the Council will consider legislation
recommended by the County Executive to cure the
deficiency.

SECTION 3. Ordinance 2988, Section 41, is hereby amended to
read as follows:

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SECTION 41: Special Programs - From the Current Expense

Fund there is hereby appropriated to:

Special Programs ((~~\$6,051,581~~)) \$6,019,090

PROVIDED THAT:

- 1) The Executive Contingency of ((~~\$256,750~~)) \$224,259 shall not be expended unless the County Executive certifies in writing that funds are available and requests that the County Council adopt an additional appropriation ordinance; upon adoption of the ordinance and signing by the Executive, funds may be expended for the purposes specified.
- 2) The provisos adopted by the Council in Ordinance 2988, as subsequently amended, shall be fulfilled.
