ORDINANCE NO. 3729

AN ORDINANCE relating to the annexation of an area known as DS-15R to Des Moines Sewer District.

STATEMENT OF FACT:

1. A notice of intention proposing the annexation of an area known as DS-15R to Des Moines Sewer District was filed with the County Council effective April 25, 1978.

2. Des Moines Sewer District has found the petition for annexation to be sufficient and has, by Resolution 78-9, concurred with the proposed annexation.

3. Des Moines Sewer District filed a Declaration of Nonsignificant Impact dated December 27, 1977, on the proposed annexation.

4. The County Council held a public hearing on May 22, 1978, and has considered the criteria set forth in RCW 56.02.060.

SECTION 1. The annexation by Des Moines Sewer District of the area known as DS-15R and described in Section 2 herein is approved.

SECTION 2. The area known as DS-15R to be annexed is described as follows:

That portion of the Southeast quarter of Section 16, Township 22 North, Range 4 East, W.M., King County, Washington, described as follows:

Beginning at the Southeast corner of the said Southeast quarter;

Thence Northerly along the East line thereof to its intersection with the centerline of the Kent Des Moines Road (S.W. Hwy 1-K);

Thence Northwesterly along said centerline to its intersection with the centerline of Pacific Highway South (State Road No. 1);

Thence Southerly along said centerline to its intersection with the South line of the said Southeast quarter;

Thence Easterly along said South line to the Southeast corner of the said Southeast quarter of Section 16 and the Point of Beginning.
