

ORDINANCE NO. 4390

AN ORDINANCE relating to road, plat and easement vacations; establishing a process for the disposition of road, plat and easement vacation petitions, amending Ordinance 129, Section 1 and K.C.C. 14.40.010.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF KING COUNTY:

SECTION 1. Ordinance 129, Section 1 and K.C.C. 14.40.010 are amended to read as follows:

Authority.

(a) Petitions for the vacation of county roads may be granted by the council in accordance with the provisions of R.C.W. Chapter 36.87 as amended by Chapter 185, Laws of 1969 First Extraordinary Session, except as provided herein, and King County shall receive compensation as provided for in this chapter.

(b) The King County Council shall continue to hold public hearings on vacations which have been recommended for approval by the Department of Public Works, as prescribed by R.C.W. 36.87.

(c) In the event the Department's Report recommends denial of the vacation petition, the following shall be the operating procedure:

(1) Written notification shall be transmitted to the petitioner by the Department of Public Works citing the rationale for the denial and indicating that the denial may be appealed to the Council. A copy of the Notice of Denial shall be filed with the Council Clerk's Office.

(2) The Notice of Denial shall be final unless the petitioner files a written appeal with the Council Clerk within thirty (30) calendar days of the issuance of the Notice of Denial.
