ORDINANCE NO. 4567

AN ORDINANCE authorizing expenditures within existing appropriations for the purpose of adjusting salaries based on merit awards, amending Ordinance No. 3969, Section 43, as amended.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF KING COUNTY:

SECTION 43. SPECIAL PROGRAMS - From the Current Expense

Fund there is hereby appropriated to:

Special Programs \$3,640,820

Included in Special Programs is an Executive Contingency of \$4,913 which shall not be expended unless the County Executive certifies in writing that funds are available and requests that the County Council adopt an additional appropriation ordinance; upon adoption, such funds may be expended for the purpose specified.

PROVIDED THAT:

- 1) The \$10,000 allocation for County support of the Seattle Multi-Model Transportation Terminal (Union Station) study be expended only if the study includes an evaluation of alternative sites and includes a study of the environmental impacts of the proposed project.
- 2) (~~The Executive shall prepare an analysis of the benefits and liabilities of the present merit pay system, report the results of such a study to the Council by March 1979, and no additional merit not already obligated shall be paid during 1979 unless explicitly approved by the Council.~~)

Expenditures for the purpose of adjusting salaries based on merit awards are authorized within existing appropriations to those employees qualifying for those awards.

3) All Council Administration employees shall be eligible for merit compensation. The Council Administrator, upon approval of the Council Personnel Committee, shall submit a list of eligible employees to the County Personnel Office.
