ORDINANCE NO. 4588

AN ORDINANCE approving additions and betterments to the Water District 104 Comprehensive Sewer Plan 1979 (MRM Investments).

PREAMBLE:

On August 27, 1979, Water District 104 passed Resolution No. 987 adopting additions and betterments to the Water District Comprehensive Sewer Plan 1979.

These additions and betterments are exempt from the provisions of the State Environmental Policy Act.

As required by KCC 13.24, the Utilities Technical Review Committee reviewed the proposed additions and betterments and on October 10, 1979 recommended their approval.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF KING COUNTY:

SECTION 1. The additions and betterments to the Water District 104 Sewer Comprehensive Plan 1979 as adopted by the District Resolution No. 987 (attached) are hereby approved.

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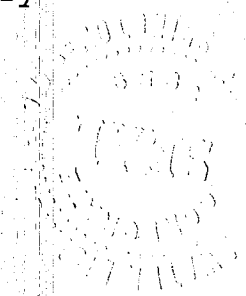

22. SPECIAL LATECOMER CHARGE STIPULATION

In addition to the fees stated herein, there will be a fixed latecomer charge payable to the District. The charge will be a pro rata share of the total cost of the Burlington Northern Railroad and State Highway crossings installed under DE S-79-2. The total cost of the crossing is to be as set forth in paragraph 21 of DE S-79-2, attached. The share for this Developer Extension shall be that proportion of the total cost which is the same as the proportion that the gross area of the DE property bears to the total gross area to be served by the crossings as established by the District. This latecomer charge will be due within 30 days after notice is given by the District as to the amount due.
