

ORDINANCE NO. 4696

AN ORDINANCE relating to Forward Thrust Ordinance No. 3977 updating certain project descriptions to show compliance with the Internal Revenue Service requirements for scheduled expenditure of bond sale proceeds, amending Ordinance No. 3977, Section 5, as amended by Ordinance No. 4210, 4251, 4329 and 4350.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF KING COUNTY:

SECTION 1. Ordinance No. 3977, Section 5, as amended is hereby amended to read as follows:

Based upon the findings of the preceding sections, the Legislative Authority hereby finds that bond proceeds in addition to those required for the original Projects have been made available for additional park and recreation facilities contemplated by the Resolution to be constructed. The Legislative Authority hereby finds the following additional projects to be public park and recreational facilities as contemplated by the Resolution and are for a County purpose. The Legislative Authority hereby specifies, ratifies and approves the expenditure of bond proceeds for the construction of the following additional park and recreation facilities in King County (amounts indicated represent bond proceeds, interest therefrom and matching funds):

1. Bear Creek Community Allocation: ~~+(32,377)~~ \$ 82,377

Bear Creek Community Plan Area: Bounded roughly by 180th Avenue N.E., Redmond/Fall City Road, the West Snoqualmie Valley Road and the Snohomish County line.

~~+(An amount of \$32,377 remains in this project account to provide future park facilities within this plan area at, as yet, undetermined sites)~~

\$25,000 from North Bear Creek Athletic Field and \$25,000 from South Bear Creek Athletic Field are being combined with \$32,377 from this project to provide the acquisition and preliminary development of an athletic field site for this service area. The combined project is named Bear Creek Athletic Field.
