ORDINANCE NO. _____

AN ORDINANCE granting approval to the City of Snoqualmie Sewer Facilities Plan as adopted by Snoqualmie City Council Resolution No. 162.

PREAMBLE:

On April 14, 1980, the Snoqualmie City Council passed Resolution No. 162, adopted the Facilities Plan and Infiltration/Inflow Survey of the City.

The Facilities Plan, prepared in December 1975, includes an environmental assessment statement from which it is concluded that this plan will not have a significant adverse impact upon the environment and, as a consequence, an EIS is not required.

As required by KCC 13.24, the Utilities Technical Review Committee reviewed the Facilities Plan and, on May 28, 1980, recommended its approval with conditions.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF KING COUNTY:

SECTION 1. The Facilities Plan and Infiltration/Inflow Survey of the City of Snoqualmie is hereby approved subject to the following conditions:

a. Sewer service is limited to within the corporate limits of the City. Any service beyond these limits is subject to separate King County approval. PROVIDED, however, that sewer service may be extended to serve the hospital site lying south of the City, and PROVIDED further that the Puget Power/Snoqualmie Falls Lodge Area, the Weyerhaeuser Mill, and the existing sewerage lagoon are outside the City corporate limits, have been historically served, and may continue to be served.

b. Sewer service to the Meadowbrook Farm annexation proposal is not included in this approval, nor is it inferred or otherwise implied.
