

ORDINANCE NO. 5266

AN ORDINANCE relating to levying the property taxes of King County for the year 1981 and declaring an emergency.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF KING COUNTY:

SECTION 1. The County Assessor of King County has certified to the County Council that the assessed valuation of the County of King as finally equalized amounts to \$45,203,558,073 and as adjusted for senior citizen exemptions provided for in RCW 84.36.381, for 20% only of watercraft in accordance with RCW 84.36.090, and for omitted assessments in accordance with RCW 84.40.080 is \$44,225,670,217.

SECTION 2. The Council of King County, Washington, finds that the levies necessary to fund estimated expenditures for the year 1981, less the total of estimated revenues from sources other than taxation, including available surplus and such expenditures as are to be met from bond warrant issues, be and the same are hereby fixed as follows:
