ORDINANCE NO. 5548

AN ORDINANCE approving the "ULID 64" Additions and Betterments to the Water District 104 Water Comprehensive Plan (Resolution No. 1203.

PREAMBLE:

On April 20, 1981, Water District 104 adopted Resolution No. 1203 which provided for the "ULID 64" additions and betterments to the district's water comprehensive plan.

This additions and betterments is exempt from the requirements of the State Environmental Policy Act.

On May 4, 1981, the proposed additions and betterments was submitted to the Utilities Technical Review Committee for review as required by KCC Chapter 13.24. On May 13, 1981, the Committee recommended its approval.


BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF KING COUNTY:


