ORDINANCE NO. 5803

AN ORDINANCE disincorporating and dissolving Water District No. 114 pursuant to RCW 36.96, and specifying the manner in which the disincorporation is to be accomplished.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF KING COUNTY:

SECTION 1. Findings and Statement of Fact. The County

Council, having held a public hearing on the 21st day of December, 19 81, pursuant to RCW 36.96.030 and proper notice having been given of said hearing and testimony and/or evidence having been received finds that:

A. The Comptroller of King County has on file no records of any disbursements or deposits or any other financial evidence of any activity by Water District No. 114 in the past five years.

B. RCW 36.96 allows the County Council to disincorporate a special purpose district on its own initiative, if any such district appears to meet the criteria by being "inactive" as defined in that chapter.

C. Water District No. 114, also known as Highland Drive Water District, was incorporated in 1961 and is located wholly within King County, a Class AA county.

D. Water District 114 has not actively carried out the special purposes or functions for which it was formed within the preceding five-year period, nor has it held elections for the purpose of electing a member of the governing body within the preceding seven-year period.

E. Alternative water resources in the form of individual or combined deep wells currently provide an adequate supply of water for domestic use to residents in the area.

F. Water District No. 114 merely adds to the number of special use districts, and the best interests of the citizens of the County will be served by disincorporation, thereby

1 eliminating a nonfunctioning and unnecessary special unit of
2 government.

3 SECTION 2. Order of Disincorporation. Based on the findings
4 set forth in Section 1, that within the preceding five-year period
5 Water District No. 114 has not fulfilled the purposes for which
6 it was formed, and the best interests of the citizens of the
7 County will be served by disincorporation, the County Council
8 hereby orders the disincorporation of Water District No. 114,
9 boundaries of said district being as follows:

10 That area included in the SW $\frac{1}{4}$ of the SW $\frac{1}{4}$ and the NW $\frac{1}{4}$
11 of the SW $\frac{1}{4}$, and SW $\frac{1}{4}$ of the NW $\frac{1}{4}$ of Section 21,
12 Township 24 North, Range 8 East, W.M. and the East
13 half of Section 20, Township 24 North, Range 8 East,
14 W.M. EXCEPT the SW $\frac{1}{4}$ of the SE $\frac{1}{4}$ and the NW $\frac{1}{4}$ of the
15 NE $\frac{1}{4}$ of said half section, King County, State of
16 Washington.

17 SECTION 3. Supervision of Liquidation of Assets. The
18 King County Executive or his designee is hereby directed to
19 supervise and administer the exchange, sale, or other means
20 of disposal of any assets, and the satisfaction of any outstanding
21 indebtedness of Water District No. 114 in accordance with RCW
22 36.96.060, on behalf of the King County Council.

23 A. King County Fund Number 09-114-0010 Water District No. 114
24 shows a cash and fund balance of \$118.28.

25 B. The sale or disposal of any assets of the district
26 shall be accomplished in the manner provided in KCC 4.56, to the
27 extent practicable. If such transfer is feasible, the King
28 County Executive or his designee shall transfer property necessary
29 to the construction, existence or management of this water system
30 to the governmental unit which succeeds Water District No. 114
31 in its operation and management.

32 SECTION 4. Distribution of Assets and Assessments to Cover
33 Costs and Expenses of Liquidation.

A. Pursuant to RCW 36.96.070 the monies on hand in the
treasury of the District and any remaining real property or
improvements, shall, after payment of all costs and expenses

1 of liquidation incurred by the County and all outstanding
2 indebtedness, become the property of King County.


3 B. In the event the monies on hand in its treasury are
4 insufficient to retire any outstanding indebtedness together
5 with all costs and expenses of liquidation, the County Executive
6 is authorized to prepare and submit to the County Council an
7 assessment levy for enactment in the manner provided by law.
8 Said levy shall be against the property in the District and in
9 amounts sufficient to retire any outstanding indebtedness and
10 such costs and expenses as may be incurred by the County in the
11 liquidation proceeding.

12 C. The King County Executive shall by July 1, 1982 report
13 to the County Council an accounting of the distribution of assets
14 and the satisfaction of any outstanding indebtedness of Water
15 District No. 114.
