

ORDINANCE NO. 5874

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AN ORDINANCE authorizing the King County Executive to enter into an Agreement to transfer Forward Thrust Funds designated for neighborhood parks to the City of Kent, Washington and authorizing the transfer of funds.

PREAMBLE:

The City of Kent has since annexed that portion of an area which will allow the fulfillment of King County obligations under King County Resolution 34571 popularly known as Forward Thrust with respect to a neighborhood park in or about the City of Kent known as Kent East Hill No. 4. King County will enter into an Agreement with City of Kent to transfer \$69,523 to the City of Kent for the use and development of that park consistent with King County Resolution 34571.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF KING COUNTY:

SECTION 1. The King County Executive is hereby authorized to enter into an Agreement with the City of Kent to transfer \$69,523 from King County to the City of Kent for use to acquire, develop and maintain a local neighborhood park designated in King County Resolution 34571 and pursuant to the authority of Section 4 of said Resolution.

A RESOLUTION of the City Council

WHEREAS the City of Kent is desirous of acquiring
and/or developing park and open space property in the East
Hill area of the City, and

WHEREAS there are monies available for such purposes
under the King County Forward Thrust Program, and

WHEREAS King County has indicated its willingness to
make such monies available to the City of Kent, and the City
is willing to accept such monies from the county, NOW,
THEREFORE

THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF KENT DO HEREBY
RESOLVE AS FOLLOWS:


1. The City of Kent be and hereby is authorized to
accept monies from King County under the auspicious
of the King County Forward Thrust Program.
2. The monies shall be used by the City solely for
the purchase and/or development of park and open
space property within the East Hill area of the
City.
3. The City in accepting and using any such monies
shall adhere to all rules and regulations pre-
scribed in King County Resolution 34571.



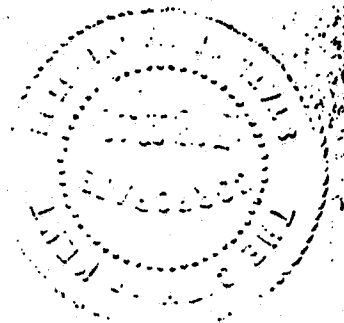


WHEREAS, the City of Kent has since annexed certain properties in which King County had the responsibility for the acquisition and the development of neighborhood parks under King County Resolution Number 34571 approved by the voters on 13 February 1968; and

WHEREAS, § § 4, 5 and 6 of Resolution 34571 authorize the transfer of funds between jurisdictions based upon certain conditions;


THEREFORE, the King County Comptroller is directed to transfer \$69,523 from § 3(E) (4) for parks in unincorporated areas near the City of Kent and such City of Kent is to assume the responsibility for acquisition and development of the neighborhood park pursuant to King County Resolution 34571;

PROVIDED FURTHER, the City of Kent will assume all legal and moral obligations and responsibility to carry out the spirit and intent of the Forward Thrust Program implemented in King County Resolution 34571.

AGREEMENT

In consideration of the mutual covenant herein King County (hereinafter called the "County") and the city of Kent (hereinafter called the "City") agree as follows:

1. The County shall deliver to the City in the ordinary course of business \$ 69,523, which is a part of the general obligation bonds of the County, funded pursuant to Resolution 34571 of the County and represents an amount of cash designated by the County to complete a neighborhood park pursuant to King County Resolution 34571, § 3(E)(4).

2. The City shall hold such money in trust and shall faithfully apply the same to the purposes authorized in said Resolution 34571 and subsections noted above in the manner and subject to conditions provided in the said Resolution; shall operate, maintain all facilities acquired, constructed, developed and approved with said money; shall defend and save the County harmless from any claim or damage resulting from the acquisition, construction, development, operation, maintenance, improvement, repair, replacement or public use of such facilities


and shall perform and comply with all conditions in said Resolution 34571 contemplated by said Resolution to be performed and complied with by the agency to which the proceeds of bonds have been allocated or delivered.
