

ORDINANCE NO. 6649

AN ORDINANCE adding a new section to K.C.C. 4.56 providing for waiver of the advertising under K.C.C. 4.56.090 in the event of an emergency and declaring an emergency.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF KING COUNTY:

SECTION 1. There is added to Ordinance 2622 and the K.C.C. 4.56 a new section to read as follows:

Emergency Waiver of Advertisement. In the event of an emergency when the public interest or property of the county would suffer material injury or damage by delay, upon declaring the existence of such emergency and reciting the facts constituting the same the director of executive administration or his/her designee may waive the requirements of K.C.C. 4.56.090 with reference to any sale provided, that such exemption shall only apply to property having a value of less than fifty thousand dollars. The executive shall report, in detail, such emergency sale to the council within thirty days of declaring an emergency.

SECTION 2. Should an emergency require the sale of property in excess of fifty thousand dollars, any such sale shall be approved by motion of the council, accompanied, if necessary, by ordinance declaring an emergency, following the executive's recommendation. The executive's recommendation shall include such statements as are necessary to fully explain the emergency. All sales of property involving an emergency circumstance shall be approved by the county executive or his designee.

SECTION 3. The county council finds as a fact and declares that an emergency exists and that this ordinance is necessary for the immediate
