PROPOSED NO. 84 - 167

ORDINANCE NO. 6762

AN ORDINANCE relating to housing and community development adopting King County's Community Development Block Grant Program for 1984; providing for the administration of Consortium Cities "population" funds; reducing the appropriation to the Community Development Block Grant Fund by \$42,263 and amending Ordinance 6597, Section 59, as amended.

PREAMBLE:

The King County Council hereby finds that:

The Housing and Community Development Act of 1974, as amended, here-inafter referred to as the "Act," establishes a program of financial assistance to local governments such as King County for the development of viable communities through the provision of decent housing, a suitable living environment and expanded economic opportunities, primarily for persons of low and moderate income.

King County has qualified as an eligible urban county applicant for Community Development Block Grant funding, hereinafter referred to as "CDBG," under the Act and is entitled to a grant of approximately \$5,424,000 for 1984, an additional \$723,651 in reprogrammed and unobligated funds from previous program years, program income of \$166,385, and \$30,000 in reallocated Jobs Bill Funds.

Under the 1984 CDBG entitlement King County will receive approximately \$2,117,701 (including 5% for Program Administration) and consortium cities will receive approximately \$735,457 in "population" funds and will share in approximately \$2,570,842 in "needs" and "joint" funds.

King County, through interlocal cooperation agreements, has formed an urban county consortium with twenty-five cities and towns of the county for the purpose of carrying out eligible activities and promoting objectives of the Act.

A Joint Policy Committee has been formed under the consortium interlocal cooperation agreements for the purpose of reviewing and recommending approval of CDBG projects to the King County council.

The King County council has held public hearings to hear and consider the views of citizens on housing and community development needs.

The King County council finds and determines that the projects and programs for which funds will be used have been developed to give maximum feasible priority to activities which will benefit low and moderate income families, aid in the prevention and elimination of slums and blight, or meet urgent community development needs.

The King County council by Motion 5747 has adopted the King County Community Development Block Grant Consortium Policy Plan for 1984, which establishes specific goals and objectives for community development and use of CDBG funds.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF KING COUNTY:

SECTION 1. The projects listed in the attachment to this ordinance are hereby adopted and approved in the funding categories and amounts therein specified and the King County executive is hereby authorized to submit the approved projects to the United States Department of Housing and Urban

Development, hereinafter referred to as "HUD."

#### PROVIDED THAT:

All projects have or will receive Joint Policy Committee approval in the exact funding categories and amounts listed in the attachment to this ordinance.

### PROVIDED FURTHER:

Projects identified as being funded with prior years funds in the amount of \$559,766 will be included with the 1984 CDBG program submitted to HUD but will be shown as amendments to the appropriate program years from which funds are being made available, as required by HUD.

SECTION 2. Upon request by a consortium jurisdiction through a duly adopted resolution of such jurisdiction; and upon a determination by the housing and community development manager that such action would conform to the goals and objectives contained in the Act, the King County Community Development Block Grant Consortium Policy Plan for 1984, and the Federal CDBG Regulations contained in the Code of Federal Regulations; the housing and community development division manager may take the following actions:

- A. Transfer "population" funds of the requesting jurisdiction between previously approved projects of the jurisdiction;
- B. Transfer unallocated "population" funds of the requesting jurisdiction to any approved project of the jurisdiction;
- C. With the concurrence of the Joint Policy Committee, transfer unallocated "population" funds of the requesting jurisdiction to any new project of the jurisdiction which constitutes an eligible activity under the Act and Regulations.
- D. Submit to HUD for approval as necessary such projects approved according to A, B, or C above.

SECTION 3. There is hereby approved and adopted a reduction in the appropriation of \$42,263 to the Community Development Block Grant Fund from a reduction in entitlement.

SECTION 4. Ordinance No. 6597, Section 59, as amended, is hereby amended to read as follows:
