

ORDINANCE NO. 7117

AN ORDINANCE conditionally approving
the City of Issaquah Comprehensive
Sanitary Sewer Plan.

PREAMBLE:

On July 6, 1984, the City of Issaquah adopted a Final
Declaration of Non-Significance for the City of Issaquah
Comprehensive Sanitary Sewer Plan.

On July 16, 1984, of Issaquah City Council passed Ordinance
No. 1624, adopting the City of Issaquah Comprehensive
Sanitary Sewer Plan.

On July 27, 1984, the City of Issaquah submitted the
Comprehensive Sanitary Sewer Plan to the Utilities
Technical Review Committee for review as required by KCC
13.24.

On September 4, 1984, the Utilities Technical Review
Committee reviewed the City of Issaquah Comprehensive
Sanitary Sewer Plan and recommended conditional approval,
based on the following findings:

Issaquah City Code Chapter 13.88 restricts sewer service
outside the city limits to:

1. Replacement of an existing main, or
2. Instances when the applicant is subject to an
existing recapture contract and the property owner
signs an agreement of nonprotest to any annexation,
and
3. Applications falling outside the above conditions
will be denied, and
4. No extension of sewer will be made when such
extension overtaxes the City's sewer system.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF KING COUNTY:

SECTION 1. The City of Issaquah Comprehensive Sanitary
Sewer Plan, dated February 1984, is hereby approved;

1 PROVIDED, that any extension of sewer facilities in the
2 Newcastle area must be consistent with the following Newcastle
3 community plan policies regarding village development on Cougar
4 Mountain: N-2, N-2a, N-2b, N-2c, N-3, N-34 and N-52. This
5 approval does not constitute King County approval or
6 endorsement of the restrictions on sewer service contained in
7 Issaquah City Code Chapter 13.88.
