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ORDINANCE NO. 7420

AN ORDINANCE relating to fees for permits, approvals and inspections issued or performed by the Building and Land Development Division; revising fees for right-of-way use permits, grading permits, building permits, mechanical permits, fire extinguishing system reviews, fire code permit and inspection fees, short subdivisions, subdivisions, environmental checklists and EIS's fees, reclassifications, conditional use permits, variances, unclassified use permits, PUD's, and shoreline substantial development permits; amending Ordinance 6713, Section 1, Ordinance 7026, Sections 1 through 9, Ordinance 7026, Sections 1 through 9, Ordinance 7227, Section 1, and Ordinance 6949, Section 13; amending KCC 14.28.040, 16.82.070, 16.86.020, 16.86.030, 17.12.030, 19.26.040, 19.28.060, 19.32.050, 20.44.110, 21.62.050, and 25.36.010.

## BE IT ORDAINED BY THE KING COUNTY COUNCIL:
