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ORDINANCE NO. _____

An Ordinance establishing a Water Utility Coordinating Committee for the Skyway Critical Water Supply Area.

PREAMBLE:

On December 16, 1985 the King County Council passed Motion 6407 adopting the Preliminary Assessment of Water Supply and Fire Protection Issues in King County, and pursuant to RCW 70.116 designating Skyway a Critical Water Supply Area.

RCW 70.116 requires a Utility Coordinating Committee to establish the boundaries of the Critical Water Supply Area and to prepare a Coordinated Water System Plan.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF KING COUNTY:

SECTION 1. A water utility coordinating committee for the Skyway Critical Water Supply Area is established for the purpose of implementing the Public Water System Coordination Act of 1977.

SECTION 2. The committee shall consist of representatives from the following agencies:

- A. The King County council
- B. Planning and community development department
- C. The Seattle-King County health department
- D. The Department of Social and Health Services.
- E. King County Water District 14
- F. King County Water District 25
- G. King County Water District 57
- H. King County Water District 63
- I. King County Water District 125
- J. City of Renton
- K. City of Seattle
- L. Skyway Sewer and Water District
- M. City of Tukwila

And all other purveyors with fifty or more service connections. Each of the listed agencies shall appoint a member and an alternate to the committee. Appointed members shall continue

1 to serve until replaced by the appointing authority in
2 accordance with the by-laws of the committee.

3 SECTION 3. A. In order for the committee to conduct
4 business, a quorum consisting of not less than half of the
5 appointed members shall be present.

6 B. At the first meeting of the committee, a chairperson
7 and rules for conducting business shall be determined by
8 consensus.

9 C. Within six months of its establishment, the committee
10 shall be responsible for developing and recommending external
11 critical water area boundaries to the county council in the
12 manner prescribed in WAC 248-56-600.

13 D. Following the establishment of the external bounda-
14 ries, the committee shall be responsible for developing a
15 coordinated water system plan for the critical water supply
16 service area in accordance with the procedures provided in
17 WAC 248-56-740. On completion of the plan, the committee shall
18 submit the plan to the Washington State Department of Social
19 and Health Services via King County which shall conduct the
20 local review required by law. The plan shall be submitted
21 within eighteen months of the establishment of the committee.

22 E. The coordinated water system plan and external
23 critical water service area boundaries shall be reviewed and
24 updated as appropriate by the committee at a minimum of every
25 five years, or sooner if the committee deems it necessary, as
26 prescribed in WAC 248-56-760.

SECTION 4. The water utility coordinating committee shall be terminated effective June 30th, 1992 unless specifically extended by ordinance.
