ORDINANCE NO. 7798

AN ORDINANCE approving the Ravensdale  
Amendment to the Water District 105  
Comprehensive Plan.

PREAMBLE:

The Washington Department of Social and Health Services  
has condemned the Ravensdale Water System due to violations  
of water quality standards. The existing source of supply  
for the Ravensdale Water System can not be upgraded to meet  
minimum water quality standards.

Water District 105, King County and the Ravensdale Water  
System have entered into agreements whereby the Water  
District 105 will develop a new well source for the  
Ravensdale Water System. Water District 105 will wholesale  
water to the Ravensdale Water System. King County will  
finance about 50% of the cost of the new source.

On June 18, 1986, Water District 105 passed Resolution 1131  
amending the District's Comprehensive Plan to provide for  
well development and wholesale water supply to the  
Ravensdale Water System.

On July 2, 1986, Water District 105 filed a Declaration of  
Non-Significance for the proposed amendment.

On August 5, 1986, the Utilities Technical Review Committee  
met and pursuant to K.C.C. 13.24 recommended approval of  
the Ravensdale Amendment.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF KING COUNTY:

SECTION 1. The Ravensdale Amendment to the Water District  
105 Comprehensive Plan as adopted by District Resolution 1131  
is hereby approved.
