ORDINANCE NO. 18150

AN ORDINANCE creating the Drug Enforcement Forfeiture Fund for drug enforcement forfeiture monies received pursuant to the Comprehensive Crime Control Act of 1984.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF KING COUNTY:

SECTION 1. There is hereby created a special fund to be known as the Drug Enforcement Forfeiture Fund for purposes of accounting for the receipt and expenditure of forfeited drug-related monies received by King County pursuant to the Comprehensive Crime Control Act of 1984. This fund shall be referred to as the "Drug Enforcement Forfeiture Fund". The Drug Enforcement Forfeiture Fund shall be maintained as a separate fund in a lawful depository or depositories within King County and earn interest as a first tier fund and may pay any reasonable and necessary service charges. The fund manager shall be the director of public safety.

SECTION 2. Any funds deposited in the Drug Enforcement Forfeiture Fund shall be expended after appropriation as provided by law solely for the purpose of enhancing enforcement of the Uniform Controlled Substances Act, Chapter 69.50 of the Revised Code of Washington, or other laws regulating controlled substances, including training, equipment and operational expenses and shall be subject to audit as provided by law including audits to be conducted by authorized representatives of the county. The director of public safety will report annually to the county executive and county council the total of all funds received from federal forfeitures and how the funds were expended.

1        SECTION 3. Any funds so deposited shall not be used to  
2 supplant existing or future resources appropriated to the  
3 department of public safety.

4        SECTION 4. If any portion of this ordinance or its  
5 application to any person or set of circumstances should be held  
6 unconstitutional, it shall not affect any other portion of this  
7 ordinance or other application to other persons or sets of  
8 circumstances.
