ORDINANCE NO. 8672

AN ORDINANCE dissolving Television Reception Improvement District No. 2, King County Washington, disbanding the district board; and repealing Ordinance No. 2863.

PREAMBLE:

On petition of the residents of Mirrormont Precinct, the King County Council established Television Reception Improvement District No. 2 pursuant to RCW 36.95.050, by Ordinance 2863, effective October 20, 1976, in part of the Tiger Mountain area of Council District 6, King County.

The ordinance also established a five member board to direct district affairs in accordance with Chapter 36.95, RCW.

By 1985, the membership of the district board had lapsed and to date, no nominations to succeed the expired membership has been forthcoming.

The availability of cable television systems in the area obviates the need for a broadcast television reception improvement district to serve the same area. Further, state law prohibits the district from being involved in the operation of cable television systems. Therefore, it appears that the residents of the area have neither the need nor desire to continue operation of the district.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF KING COUNTY:

SECTION 1. Ordinance 2863, establishing King County Television Reception Improvement District No. 2 in Mirrormont precinct, is hereby repealed, the district dissolved and the district board disestablished pursuant to RCW 36.95.200.

Any fund balance remaining in the district account shall be transferred to the current expense fund, and any property owned by the district on the effective date of this ordinance shall be disposed of by the county executive in the manner provided in RCW 36.95.200 and Chapter 36.34, RCW.
