PROPOSED NO. 88 - 579

ORDINANCE NO. 8696

AN ORDINANCE transferring staff from Natural Resources and Parks to Surface Water Management; amending Ordinance 8331, Section 18 and Section 50 as amended.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF KING COUNTY:

SECTION 1. There is hereby approved and adopted a transfer of 9.5 FTE's from Natural Resources and Parks to Surface Water Management to implement the consolidation of basin planning functions in the Surface Water Management Program.

SECTION 2. Ordinance 8331 Section 18 is hereby amended as follows:

SECTION 18. NATURAL RESOURCES AND PARKS - From the Current Expense Fund there is hereby appropriated to:

Natural Resources and Parks \$12,799,330

The maximum number of FTE's to be budgeted for Natural Resources and Parks shall be: ((223.7)) 214.2

Provided that:

Natural resources and parks division shall secure state recognition and appropriate funding of the Seattle 4-H fair as a satellite activity of the King County fair.

SECTION 3. Ordinance 8331 Section 50 is hereby amended as follows:

SECTION 50. SURFACE WATER MANAGEMENT - From the Surface Water Management Fund there is hereby appropriated to:

Surface Water Management \$ 7,547,567

The maximum number of FTE's to be budgeted for Surface Water Management Program shall be: ((62.0)) 71.5




