

ORDINANCE NO. **9004**

AN ORDINANCE relating to Council rules and order of business; amending Ordinance 1373, Section 9, as amended and K.C.C. 1.24.080.

PREAMBLE:

In order for the office of the clerk of the council to maintain adequate records of proposed legislation prior to official introduction by a council member, it is necessary that ordinances and motions be given a proposed number when received in the clerk's office.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF KING COUNTY:

SECTION 1. Ordinance No. 1373, Section 9, as amended and K.C.C. 1.24.080 are hereby amended to read as follows:

Introduction of proposed ordinances and motions. Upon ~~((the signature of at least one member of the council))~~ receipt of an ordinance or motion by the office of the clerk of the council; a proposed number shall be assigned to each proposed ordinance or motion. Such proposed number will be used for filing and locating the legislation in the clerk's office.

Upon signature of at least one member of the council, the proposed ordinance or motion will be placed on a council agenda. The first reading of a proposed ordinance shall be by title only, unless three members demand reading in full.

After the first reading, proposed ordinances shall be referred to committee. Upon being reported back with a recommendation, signed by a majority of the committee, all proposed ordinances shall be placed upon the calendar for public hearing and second reading.
