ORDINANCE NO. **9171**

AN ORDINANCE making an appropriation of \$40,000 to the Health and Human Services Set-Aside for the County's contribution to the Men Working Against Abuse Program and an appropriation of \$45,300 to the Human Services Fund--Developmental Disabilities Program from additional revenues from the United States Department of Education (\$32,800) for young persons who are eligible for developmental disabilities services who are deaf and blind, and from the Washington State Department of Services for the Blind (\$12,500) for employment services for eligible persons with developmental disabilities and blindness; and amending Ordinance No. 8802, Sections 44 and 61, as amended.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF KING COUNTY:

SECTION 1. There is hereby approved and adopted an appropriation of \$40,000 to the Health and Human Services Set-Aside for the county's contribution to the Men Working Against Abuse Program and an appropriation of \$45,300 from additional revenues from the United States Department of Education (\$32,800) to provide services for young persons who are eligible for developmental disabilities services who are deaf and blind, and from the Washington State Department of Services for the Blind (\$12,500) to provide employment services for eligible persons with developmental disabilities and blindness.

SECTION 2. Ordinance No. 8802, Section 44, is hereby amended by adding thereto and inserting therein the following:



Dear Councilmembers Sims and Grant:

On October 16, 1989, the King County Council adopted Ordinance 9171, which appropriated \$40,000 to the Health and Human Services Set Aside for the County's contribution to the Men Working Against Abuse Program. While I believe that this is a very worthwhile program, I am allowing this Ordinance to lapse into law without my signature.

It is my understanding that this additional appropriation occurred in a Council-initiated substitute ordinance to a Health and Human Services Set Aside revenue-backed appropriation ordinance that was before the Finance Committee.

While I appreciate your desire to fund needed programs, I think it important for all of us to remember that due to the impact of the recent annexations and incorporations, the Health and Human Service Set Aside has limited resources to take on new programs. In the future, if the Council would like to take action to increase appropriations for new programs, I believe it is important that the proposed increase be discussed with the Department and the Budget Division.
