

ORDINANCE NO. **9227**

AN ORDINANCE relating to fees charged for the use of King County parks and recreation facilities and amending Ordinance No. 7860, as amended, and K.C.C. 7.08.020 through K.C.C. 7.08.040.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF KING COUNTY:

SECTION 1. Ordinance No. 7860, Section 2, and K.C.C. 7.08.020 are amended to read as follows:

I. Swimming pool facilities (except King County Aquatics Center). Swimming pool facilities fees shall be:

A. Swimming pool fees (fees include sales tax)

- Public Swims:..... \$1.00 per person per session
- Fifty Cent Swims:..... .50 per person per session
- Adult Only Swims: 1.50 per person per session
- Senior citizens-60 years plus..... 1.00 per person for any

program session.

B. Swim lessons: \$1.00 per half hour to \$10.00 per half hour

C. Facilities Usage: Indoors and Outdoors

1. Activity Center Only

Includes meetings or activities that are promoted, organized, managed, supervised and sponsored by civic or nonprofit organizations such as community clubs, Orthopedic Guilds, service clubs, and public meetings. If the activity under sponsorship is open to the public and conforms to the rules of the activity center and is scheduled during the activity center program hours, there is no charge.

2. Activity Centers and Community Centers

(For any organizations, groups and clubs, using an activity or community center during nonprogram hours, or a community center at any time during the day or evening, the following fee schedule will be applied.)

Gymnasium fee \$20.00 per hour (2 hour minimum)

Meeting room fee . . . \$15.00 per hour (2 hour minimum)

3. Kitchen Use Fee (All facilities except Clise Mansion)

(Facility users will not be assessed a kitchen fee to obtain water for coffee pots).

Kitchen use fees \$ 5.00 per hour (2 hour minimum)

4. Creek Lodge Use Fee (Rate includes use of Kitchen)

Meeting Room: \$15.00 per hour (2 hour minimum)

Youth Groups \$75.00 per night

6. Outdoor Facility Use Fee

(Any groups renting outdoor facilities for activities including, but not limited to, dog shows, outdoor weddings, day camps, Fun Runs and organized picnics will pay according to the following fee schedule.)

1-100 participants \$30.00 per day

101+ participants \$0.30 per participant per day

7. Reservation Form Handling Fee

All groups will be assessed a \$5.00 handling fee per Reservation Form.

8. Admission and/or Concession Fees - 20% of gross revenue

(will assess 20% to gross revenue collected by renter from admission/participant fees and/or sales of goods and/or services.

9. Special Facility Use Fee

Luther Burbank Amphitheater \$20.00 per hour, 2 hour minimum

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Racquetball Courts - White Center Park . . . (~~(\$4.00)~~) \$6.00 per hour

10. Camping Fee . . . \$7.00 per site (includes tax)

11. Public Event Parking Fee .. \$3.00 per car (includes tax)

12. Pea Patch Rental. \$25.00 per plot per season

Two plots \$40.00 per person per season

13. Total Detector Permits . . \$10.00 per year per individual \$15.00 per
year per family (4 maximum)

14. Special Use Permits

Groups renting facilities for special event activities shall pay
fees determined through negotiated contract.

15. Power Fees, Damage and Key Deposits

For any organizations, groups, or clubs using an activity center or
community center, power fees and a damage and key deposit fee may be
assessed according to the following schedule.

Power Fees \$25.00 per day

Damage deposit \$25.00 to \$200.00

(determined by type of activity and number of participants)

Key deposit \$25.00 to \$50.00

(determined by type of activity and number of participants)

Moorage fees \$6.00 per night (including tax)

For boats 26 feet in length and over
\$4.00 per night (including





ORDINANCE NO. **9228**

AN ORDINANCE relating to the annexation of an area known as 89-1 to King County Water District No. 90.

STATEMENT OF FACT:

1. A notice of intention proposing the annexation of an area known as 89-1 to King County Water District No. 90 was filed with the county council effective June 20, 1989.

2. King County Water District No. 90 has found the petition for annexation to be sufficient and has, by Resolution No. 538 concurred with the proposed annexation.

3. King County Water District No. 90 filed a Declaration of Non-significant Impact dated April 4, 1989, on the proposed annexation.

4. The county council held a public hearing on the 27th day of November, 19 89 and has considered the criteria set forth in R.C.W. 57.02.040.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF KING COUNTY:

SECTION 1. The annexation by King County Water District No. 90 of the area known as 89-1 and described in Section 4 herein is approved for the area only which lies within the Newcastle Community Plan area. The portion lying within the Tahoma Raven Heights Community Plan area is denied because public water service is not allowed. This proposed revised annexation is consistent with R.C.W. 57.02.040 for the Newcastle Community Plan area as described in the attached King County Council Annexation Report on 89-1.

SECTION 2. King County Water District No. 90 is the appropriate entity to serve the area proposed to be annexed.
