ORDINANCE NO. 9337

AN ORDINANCE relating to the vacation of portions of Southwest 104th Street. Petitioners: Mallard Lake Apartments and Others File No. V-2032.

STATEMENT OF FACTS:

- 1. A petition has been filed requesting vacation of portions of Southwest 104th Street, hereinafter described.
- 2. The department of public works has notified the various utilities serving the area and has been advised that easements may be required by Seattle City Light, Seattle Water Department, Water District No. 45, U.S. West Telephone Company and the Southwest Suburban Sewer District. King County has an Overhead and Underground Utility Easement to the City of Seattle, which will be processed when the Ordinance is completed. According to the Easement, it is understood and agreed that the City of Seattle, City Light Department, may grant other utilities the right and privilege to occupy and use jointly said distribution system and/or easement.
- 3. The building and land development division has studied the proposed road vacation and finds that it would not be in conflict with the principles and purposes of the King County Comprehensive Plan and the specific plans in the vicinity of this proposed vacation.
- 4. The department of public works found no evidence that the vacation area has ever been opened as a road. A search of the records indicates that no public funds have been expended for its acquisition, improvement or maintenance. The road is, therefore, classified "C Class" in accordance with King County Ordinance No. 2759.
- 5. The department of public works considers the subject right-of-way useless as part of the county road system and believes the public would benefit by the return of this unused area to the public tax rolls.

In consideration of the benefits to be derived from the subject vacation, the council has determined that it is in the best interest of the citizens of King County to grant said petition.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF KING COUNTY:

SECTION 1. The council, on the <u>26th</u> day of <u>February</u>, 19<u>90</u>, hereby vacates and abandons the following described portion of Southwest 104th Street:

That portion of the Northwest 1/4 of Section 6, Township 23 North, range 4 East, W.M., King County, Washington, described as follows:

Southwest 104th street lying Westerly of the Southerly extension of the West margin of 12th Avenue Southwest and lying Easterly of a line located 5 feet Westerly of and parallel with the Southerly extension of the West margin of 14th Avenue Southwest.

Contains an area of 18,150 square feet, or 0.417 acres, M/L.

SECTION 2. The King County Executive is authorized to grant an Underground and Overhead Utility Easement in favor of the City of Seattle over, upon and across said described lands.

SECTION 3. The King County Executive is requested to submit for council approval any leases of county land resulting from the vacation described herein.
