ORDINANCE NO. **9471**

AN ORDINANCE relating to comprehensive solid waste management planning; adopting the 1989 King County Comprehensive Solid Waste Management Plan as the comprehensive solid waste management plan for King County and the cities that have signed the Solid Waste Interlocal Agreements and adding a new section to KCC 10.24.

PREAMBLE:

The 1989 King County Comprehensive Solid Waste Management Plan was prepared in accordance with the requirements of RCW 70.95 which requires each county within the State, in cooperation with the various cities located within such county, to prepare a coordinated, comprehensive solid waste management plan. King County is designated as the solid waste management planning authority under the terms of the Solid Waste Interlocal Agreement.

The 1989 Comprehensive Solid Waste Management Plan is prepared pursuant to direction of Ordinance 7737 and incorporates programmatic solid waste management policies adopted in King County Ordinance 8771. The 1989 Comprehensive Solid Waste Management Plan has been prepared to conform to new State policy for waste reduction and recycling (WR/R) programs required by the state Waste Not Washington Act, Substitute House Bill 1671. A final environmental impact statement for the 1989 Comprehensive Solid Waste Management Plan was issued in July 1989. The City of Seattle has prepared a plan independently for its solid waste and delivered it to King County under RCW 70.95.080(1) for incorporation into the King County Plan.

The King County Solid Waste Advisory Committee reviewed the 1989 Comprehensive Solid Waste Management Plan and provided input throughout the Plan's development.

On November 9, 1989, the Solid Waste Interlocal Forum passed Resolution 89-005 recommending adoption of the Plan with the amendments contained in Attachment A. The Plan has been adopted by cities representing three-quarters of the population of incorporated jurisdictions that are parties to the Solid Waste Interlocal Agreement and taking formal action to approve or disapprove the Plan within 120 days of receipt of the Forum Resolution 89-005 in accordance with Section 10.6.b. of the interlocal agreement.
