ORDINANCE NO. **9927**

AN ORDINANCE making appropriations to several solid waste division funds for several different purposes, and amending Ordinance 9720, Section 78 and 94, as amended.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF KING COUNTY:

SECTION 1. There is hereby approved and adopted an appropriation of \$18,009,772 from the unappropriated Solid Waste Fund balance (Fund 404) to the solid waste division (Fund 404) to establish expenditure authority for the remaining seven months in 1991, \$49,519 from the unappropriated Energy Resource and Recovery Fund balance (Fund 382) to the Energy Resource and Recovery Fund (Fund 382) for purposes of refunding to the City of Seattle interest accrued due to the delayed refunding of the City's E/RR contribution, and \$9,344,499 from the unappropriated Landfill Reserve Fund (Fund 391) balance to the Solid Waste Construction - 1987 (Fund 303) for purposes of supporting landfill closure project costs consistent with Ordinance 9271.

Section 2. Ordinance 9720, Section 78, as amended, is hereby amended to read as follows:

From the Solid Waste Fund there is hereby appropriated to:
