

ORDINANCE NO. 9982

1  
2 AN ORDINANCE changing the boundary of the  
3 Sewer Local Service Area in the Northshore  
4 Community Plan Area due to a documented  
5 potential public health hazard and amending  
6 Ordinance 3325, Section 2 as amended  
7 (Appendix A) and the King County General  
8 Sewerage Plan (Ordinance 4035) and  
9 declaring an emergency.

10 PREAMBLE:

11 For the purpose of effective planning and regulations, the  
12 King County council makes the following findings:

- 13 1. Two parcels of land located outside of the Sewer Local  
14 Service Area in the Northshore Community Plan area are  
15 creating a potential public health hazard due to a high  
16 water table, surface water in the drainfield, and  
17 marginal soil quality.
- 18 2. The Seattle-King County department of public health  
19 verifies this potential public health hazard and further  
20 states that the only remedy is the installation of  
21 sanitary sewers.
- 22 3. The King County Sewerage General Plan requires the local  
23 sewer agency to demonstrate an existing or potential  
24 health hazard and that alternative methods of sewage  
25 disposal are financially or technically infeasible.
- 26 4. The Woodinville Water and Sewer District does  
27 substantiate the potential public health hazard and the  
28 necessity to provide sewer service to the area.

29 BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF KING COUNTY:

30 SECTION 1. Ordinance 3325, Section 2, as amended (Appendix  
31 A) is hereby amended. The Sewer Local Service Area boundary is  
32 changed to include the two parcels depicted in Attachment A.  
33 The sewer line shall be sized to serve only these two parcels  
34 and shall not be available for additional connections unless it  
35 is consistent with the Northshore Community Plan.

36 SECTION 2. Ordinance 4035 previously adopting the King  
37 County Sewerage General Plan is hereby amended pursuant to the  
38 depiction on Attachment A.

39 SECTION 3. The county finds as a fact and declares that an  
40 emergency exists and that this ordinance is necessary for the  
41 immediate preservation of public peace, health or safety or for

1 the support of county government and its existing public  
2 institutions.
