ORDINANCE NO. **10018**

AN ORDINANCE relating to solid waste disposal rates and amending Resolution 8778, Section 2 as amended, and K.C.C. 10.04.020; Ordinance 5231, Section 1, as amended, and K.C.C. 10.12.020; Ordinance 800, Section 3, as amended, and K.C.C. 10.12.030; and K.C.C. 10.12.025 and adding a new section to K.C.C. 10.08.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF KING COUNTY:

SECTION 1. Resolution 8778, Section 2, as amended, and K.C.C. 10.04.020 are hereby amended to read as follows:

Definitions. The following definitions shall apply in the interpretation and enforcement of this title:

A. "Agricultural wastes" means non-dangerous wastes on farms resulting from the production of agricultural products including but not limited to manures and carcasses of dead animals weighing each or collectively in excess of fifteen pounds.

B. "Asbestos-containing waste material" means any waste that contains asbestos. This term includes, but is not limited to, asbestos waste from control devices, contaminated clothing, asbestos waste material, materials used to enclose the work area during an asbestos project, and bags or containers that previously contained asbestos.

C. "Ashes" means the residue including any air pollution control equipment flue dusts from combustion or incineration of material including solid wastes.

D. "Bulky waste" means large items of refuse, such as appliances, furniture, and other oversize wastes which would typically not fit into reusable solid waste containers.

E. "Certified hauler or certificated hauler" means any person engaged in the business of solid waste handling having a certificate granted by the Washington Utilities and Transportation Commission for that purpose.

1 F. "Charitable organization" means any organization which
2 meets the following criteria: must be defined by the Internal
3 Revenue Service as a 501(c)3 charitable organization; must be
4 engaged as a primary form of business in the processing of
5 abandoned goods for resale or reuse; and must have an account
6 with the Solid Waste Division.

7 G. "Clean soils and clean dredge spoils" means soils and
8 dredge spoils which are not dangerous wastes or problem wastes
9 as defined in this chapter.

10 ((G-)) H. "Commercial hauler" means any person, firm or
11 corporation including but not limited to "certified hauler," as
12 defined herein, collecting or transporting solid waste for hire
13 or consideration.

14 ((H-)) I. "Compacted waste" means any solid waste whose
15 volume is less than in the loose condition as a result of
16 compression.

17 ((I-)) J. "Controlled solid waste" means all solid waste
18 generated, collected or disposed within the unincorporated
19 areas of King County and all solid waste generated, collected
20 or disposed within any other jurisdiction with which a solid
21 waste interlocal agreement, as defined herein, exists.

22 ((J-)) K. "Dangerous wastes" means any solid waste
23 designated as dangerous waste by the Washington State
24 Department of Ecology under chapter 173-303 WAC.

25 ((K-)) L. "Demolition wastes" means solid waste, largely
26 inert waste resulting from the demolition, razing or
27 construction of buildings, roads, and other man-made
28 structures. Demolition waste consists of, but is not limited
29 to, concrete, brick, bituminous concrete, wood and masonry,
30 composition roofing and roofing paper, steel, and minor amounts
31 of other metals like copper. Plaster (i.e., sheet rock or
32 plaster board) or any other material, that is likely to produce
33 gases or a leachate during the decomposition process and
34 asbestos wastes are not considered to be demolition waste for
35 the purposes of this chapter.

1 (~~L~~) M. "Designated interlocal forum" means a group of
2 representatives of unincorporated King County and of
3 incorporated cities and towns within King County designated by
4 the council of King County and by interlocal agreement with the
5 cities in King County to discuss solid waste issues and
6 facilitate regional interlocal cooperation in solid waste
7 management.

8 (~~M~~) N. "Disposal" means the discharge, deposit,
9 injection, dumping, leaking, or placing of any solid waste into
10 or on any land or water.

11 (~~N~~) O. "Disposal facility" is a disposal site or
12 interim solid waste handling facility. This includes, but is
13 not limited to, transfer stations included as part of the
14 county disposal system, landfills, incinerators, composting
15 plants, and facilities for the recycling or recovery of
16 resources from solid wastes or the conversion of the energy
17 from such wastes to more useful forms or combinations thereof.

18 (~~O~~) P. "Disposal site" means a site or sites approved
19 by the council of King County where any final treatment,
20 utilization, processing or disposition of solid waste occurs.

21 (~~P~~) Q. "Disposal system" means the system of disposal
22 facilities, rules and procedures established pursuant to this
23 title.

24 (~~Q~~) R. "Drop box facility" means a facility used for
25 the placement of a detachable solid waste container, i.e., drop
26 boxes, including the area adjacent for necessary entrance and
27 exit roads, unloading, and turnaround areas. Drop box
28 facilities normally serve the general public with loose loads
29 and receive waste from off-site. Drop box facilities may also
30 include containers for separated recyclables.

31 (~~R~~) S. "Division" means the solid waste division of
32 the king county public works department.

33 (~~S~~) T. "Energy resource recovery" means the recovery
34 of energy in a usable form from mass burning or refuse derived
35 fuel incineration, pyrolysis or any other means of using the

1 heat of combustion of solid waste that involves high
2 temperature (above 1200 degrees Fahrenheit) processing.

3 ((P-)) U. "Garbage" means unwanted animal and vegetable
4 wastes and animal and vegetable wastes resulting from the
5 handling, preparation, cooking and consumption of food, swill,
6 and carcasses of dead animals and of such a character and
7 proportion as to be capable of attracting or providing food for
8 vectors, except sewage and sewage sludge.

9 ((Q-)) V. "Hazardous wastes" means and includes, but is
10 not limited to explosives, medical wastes, radioactive wastes,
11 pesticides and chemicals which are potentially harmful to the
12 public health or the environment. Unless otherwise defined by
13 the King County board of health, such waste shall have the
14 meaning as defined by the Washington State Department of
15 Ecology and the Washington Administrative Code.

16 ((R-)) W. "Hazardous waste management plan" means a plan
17 for managing moderate risk wastes, pursuant to RCW 70.105.220.

18 ((S-)) X. "Health department" means the Seattle-King
19 County health department.

20 ((T-)) Y. "Health officer" means the King County director
21 of public health, or his authorized agent.

22 ((U-)) Z. "Industrial solid wastes" means waste
23 by-products from manufacturing and fabricating operations such
24 as scraps, trimmings, packing, and other discarded materials
25 not otherwise designated as dangerous waste under Chapter
26 173-303 WAC.

27 ((V-)) AA. "Interim solid waste handling facility" means
28 any interim treatment, utilization or processing site engaged
29 in solid waste handling which is not the final disposal site.
30 Transfer stations, drop boxes, baling and compaction sites,
31 source separation centers, intermediate processing facilities,
32 mixed waste processing facilities and treatment facilities are
33 considered interim solid waste handling sites.

34 ((AA-)) BB. "Intermediate processing facility" means any
35 facility that sorts mixed recyclables from source separation

1 programs to divide them into individual component recyclable
2 materials or to process them for marketing.

3 ((~~BB-~~)) CC. "King County Solid Waste Advisory Committee"
4 means the committee formed pursuant to King County Ordinance
5 6862 and RCW Chapter 70.95 to advise the county on solid waste
6 management planning, assist in the development of programs and
7 policies concerning solid waste management, and review and
8 comment on the plan and other proposed solid waste management
9 rules, policies or ordinance prior to adoption.

10 ((~~CC-~~)) DD. "Landclearing wastes" means solid wastes
11 resulting from the clearing of land for new construction and
12 includes, but is not limited to, stumps and other vegetation,
13 rocks, mud and other plant or mineral wastes.

14 ((~~DD-~~)) EE. "Landfill" means a disposal site or part of a
15 site at which waste is placed in or on land and which is not a
16 landspreading disposal facility.

17 ((~~EE-~~)) FF. "Landspreading disposal facility" means a
18 facility that applies sludge or other solid wastes onto or
19 incorporates solid waste into the soil surface at greater than
20 vegetative utilization and soil conditioners/immobilization
21 rates.

22 ((~~FF-~~)) GG. "Liquid" means a substance that flows readily
23 and assumes the form of its container but retains its
24 independent volume.

25 ((~~GG-~~)) HH. "Littering" means to accumulate, or place,
26 throw, deposit, put into or in any land or water or otherwise
27 dispose of refuse including rubbish, ashes, garbage, dead
28 animals, industrial refuse, commercial waste and all other
29 waste material of every kind and description in any manner
30 except as authorized by this chapter.

31 ((~~HH-~~)) II. "Manager" means the manager of the solid
32 waste division of the department of public works of King
33 County.

34 ((~~II-~~)) JJ. "Medical waste" means all waste so defined by
35 the King County board of health rules and regulations.

1 ((JJ-)) KK. "Mixed municipal solid waste" means waste
2 consisting of solid waste generated by residences, stores,
3 offices, and other generators of wastes that are not
4 industrial, agricultural, or demolition wastes.

5 ((KK-)) LL. "Mixed waste processing" means sorting of
6 solid waste after collection from the point of generation in
7 order to remove recyclables from the solid waste to be
8 disposed.

9 ((LL-)) MM. "Mobile yard waste facility" means a yard
10 waste facility requiring no above-grade constriction and
11 established on a temporary basis. For the purposes of Section
12 10.12.020, a mobile yard waste facility shall be considered to
13 be a disposal site without scales.

14 ((MM-)) NN. "Moderate risk waste" means:

15 1. any waste that exhibits any of the properties of
16 hazardous waste but is exempt from regulation under RCW chapter
17 70.105 solely because the waste is generated in quantities
18 below the threshold for regulation, and

19 2. any household wastes which are generated from the
20 disposal of substances identified by the department of ecology
21 as hazardous household substances.

22 ((NN-)) OO. "Multi-family Structure" means any
23 residential structure designed exclusively for occupancy by two
24 or more families living independently of each other receiving
25 solid waste collection service as an entire structure or
26 complex and the structure or complex is billed for solid waste
27 collection service as a whole and not by individual dwelling
28 units.

29 ((OO-)) PP. "Noncommercial user" means any person not
30 engaged in the business of solid waste handling.

31 ((PP-)) QQ. "Operating hours" means those times during
32 which disposal facilities are normally open and available for
33 the delivery of solid wastes.

34 ((QQ-)) RR. "Person" means any individual, association,
35 firm, corporation, partnership, political subdivision,

1 municipality, government agency, industry, public or private
2 corporation, or any other entity.

3 ((RR-)) SS. "Plan" means the coordinated comprehensive
4 solid waste management plan for the county as required by RCW
5 Chapter 70.95.

6 ((SS-)) TT. "Problem wastes" means:

7 1. soils removed during the cleanup of a remedial
8 action site, or a dangerous waste site closure or other cleanup
9 efforts and actions and which contain harmful substances but
10 are not designated dangerous wastes, or

11 2. dredge spoils resulting from the dredging of surface
12 waters of the state where contaminants are present in the
13 dredge spoils at concentrations not suitable for open water
14 disposal and the dredge spoils are not dangerous wastes and are
15 not regulated by the Federal Clean Water Act.

16 ((TT-)) UU. "Procurement policy" means the development
17 and implementation of a policy which achieves the purchase of
18 products made from recycled and/or recyclable goods.

19 ((UU-)) VV. "Receivers" means persons who will reuse
20 recyclables and to whom source separated recyclables for which
21 a market does not presently exist can be delivered at little or
22 no cost in order to avoid landfilling the materials pending
23 development of economic markets.

24 ((VV-)) WW. "Reclamation site" means a location used for
25 the processing or the storage of recycled waste.

26 ((WW-)) XX. "Recyclables" means any material that can be
27 kept out of or recovered from solid waste and the resources
28 therein be transformed and/or reused including, but not limited
29 to, mixed paper, newsprint, cardboard, aluminum, glass,
30 plastics, chemicals, oil, wood, compostable organics (food and
31 yard debris), ferrous metal, and inorganics (rubble and inert
32 material).

33 ((XX-)) YY. "Recycling" means either source separation or
34 the processing of solid waste mechanically or by hand to
35 segregate materials for sale or reuse. Materials which can be

1 removed through recycling include but are not limited to mixed
2 paper, newsprint, cardboard, aluminum, glass, plastics,
3 chemicals, oil, wood, compostable organics (food and yard
4 debris), ferrous metal, and inorganics (rubble and inert
5 material). Recycling does not include combustion of solid
6 waste or preparation of a fuel from solid waste.

7 (~~YY-~~) ZZ. "Refuse" means garbage, rubbish, ashes, swill
8 and all other putrescible and nonputrescible wastes, except
9 sewage, from all public and private establishments and
10 residences.

11 (~~ZZ-~~) AAA. "Regional approach" means the development
12 and implementation of a solid waste management program in
13 cooperation with municipalities in King County and with other
14 counties within the Puget Sound area.

15 (~~AAA-~~) BBB. "Regional direct" means any solid waste
16 transported to Cedar Hills disposal site by conventional long
17 haul transfer vehicles, transporting from solid waste transfer
18 stations solid waste generated and collected in King County.

19 (~~BBB-~~) CCC. "Reuse" means the return of a commodity
20 into the economic stream for use.

21 (~~CCC-~~) DDD. "Rubbish" means all nonputrescible wastes
22 from all public and private establishments and from all
23 residences.

24 (~~DDD-~~) EEE. "Secured load" means a load of solid waste
25 which has been secured or covered in the vehicle in a manner
26 that will prevent any part of the solid waste from leaving the
27 vehicle while the vehicle is moving.

28 FFF. "Self-Hauler" means all vehicles that are neither
29 passenger licensed vehicles nor vehicles used by solid waste
30 collection entities in their solid waste collection operations.

31 (~~EEE-~~) GGG. "Single Family Dwelling" means any
32 residential unit receiving solid waste collection service as an
33 individual unit and the dwelling is billed for solid waste
34 collection service as an individual dwelling.

1 (~~FFF.~~) HHH. "Solid waste" means all putrescible and
2 nonputrescible solid and semisolid wastes, except wastes
3 identified in WAC 173-304-015, including but not limited to
4 garbage, rubbish, ashes, industrial wastes, swill, demolition
5 and construction wastes, abandoned vehicles or parts thereof,
6 discarded commodities, sludge from wastewater treatment plants
7 and septage from septic tanks, woodwaste, dangerous waste, and
8 problem wastes. This includes all liquid, solid and semisolid
9 materials which are not the primary products of public,
10 private, industrial, commercial, mining and agricultural
11 operations. Unrecovered residue from recycling operations
12 shall be considered solid waste.

13 III. "Solid Waste Collection Entity" means every person or
14 his lessees, receivers, or trustees, owning, controlling,
15 operating or managing vehicles used in the business of
16 transporting solid waste for collection and/or disposal for
17 compensation including all certified haulers, or any city using
18 its own employees, or any company operating pursuant to a
19 contract with or franchise from a city performing solid waste
20 collection services within the city.

21 (~~GGG.~~) JJJ. "Solid waste interlocal agreement" means an
22 agreement between a city and the county for use of King County
23 disposal system for solid waste generated or collected within
24 the city.

25 (~~HHH.~~) KKK. "Solid waste management" means the
26 systematic administration of activities which provide for the
27 reduction in generated volume, source separation, collection,
28 storage, transportation, transfer, recycling, processing,
29 treatment and disposal of solid waste. This includes public
30 education and marketing activities.

31 (~~HHH.~~) LLL. "Source separation" means the process of
32 separating recyclable materials from material which will become
33 solid waste at its source.

34 (~~HHH.~~) MMM. "Suspect waste" means any waste the manager
35 suspects may be unauthorized waste.

1 (~~JJJ~~) NNN. "Swill" means every refuse accumulation of
2 animal, fruit or vegetable matter, liquid or otherwise, that
3 attend the preparation, use, cooking, dealing in or storing of
4 meat, fish, fowl, fruit and vegetables, except coffee grounds.

5 (~~KKK~~) OOO. "Transfer station" means a staffed, fixed,
6 supplemental collection and transportation facility used by
7 persons and route collection vehicles to deposit collected
8 solid waste from off-site into a larger transfer vehicle for
9 transport to a permanent disposal site. It may also include
10 recycling facilities.

11 (~~LLL~~) PPP. "Unauthorized waste" means waste which is
12 waste not acceptable for disposal at any or a specific disposal
13 facility according to applicable rules and regulations or a
14 determination of the manager.

15 (~~MMM~~) QQQ. "Uncompacted waste" means any solid waste
16 in an uncompressed or loose condition.

17 (~~NNN~~) RRR. "Unincorporated Urban Service Area" means
18 a geographical area of urban unincorporated King County
19 designated to receive solid waste, recyclables, and yard waste
20 collection services.

21 (~~OOO~~) SSS. "Waste reduction" means reducing the amount
22 or type of waste generated.

23 (~~PPP~~) TTT. "Woodwaste" means solid waste consisting of
24 wood pieces or particles generated as a by-product resulting
25 from the handling and processing of wood, including, but not
26 limited to, hog fuel, sawdust, shavings, chips, bark, small
27 pieces of wood, stumps, limbs and any other material composed
28 largely of wood which has no significant commercial value at
29 the time in question, (but shall not include slash developed
30 from logging operations unless disposed of on a different
31 site), and does not include wood pieces or particles containing
32 chemical preservatives such as creosote, pentachlorophenol, or
33 copper-chrome-arsenate.

34 (~~QQQ~~) UUU. "Yard waste" means a compostable organic
35 material generated in yards or gardens, including but not

1 limited to, leaves, grass, branches, prunings, and clippings of
2 woody and fleshy plants and unflocked Christmas trees, but
3 shall not include rocks, dirt or sod, concrete, asphalt,
4 bricks, landclearing wastes, demolition wastes, woodwaste or
5 food waste.

6 ((RRR-)) VVV. "Yard waste facility" means a facility used
7 by county residents to deposit source separated yard waste.

8 SECTION 2. Ordinance 5231, Section 1, and K.C.C.
9 10.12.020 are hereby amended to read as follows:

10 Fees for use of disposal sites. All persons using
11 county-operated solid waste disposal facilities shall pay the
12 service fees set forth in the following schedules:

13 A. Through December 31, 1991, ((S)) service fees for the
14 use of disposal sites with scales, excluding Cedar Hills, shall
15 be:

- 16 1. Solid waste disposal:
- 17 Passenger licensed vehicles..... \$ 6.50 per entry
- 18 Other vehicles..... \$47.00 per ton
- 19 Minimum Charge..... \$ 6.50 per vehicle

- 20 2. Deposit of source separated yard waste at disposal
- 21 sites with yard waste facilities:
- 22 Passenger licensed vehicles..... \$ 4.00 per entry
- 23 Other vehicles..... \$31.00 per ton
- 24 Minimum Charge..... \$ 4.00 per vehicle

25 B. Service fees for the use of disposal sites without
26 scales shall be based upon the cubic yard or fraction thereof
27 as follows:

- 28 1. Solid waste disposal:
- 29 Passenger licensed vehicles..... \$ 6.50 per entry
- 30 Other vehicles
- 31 Compacted wastes..... \$14.00 per cubic
- 32 yard
- 33 Uncompacted wastes..... \$ 8.00 per cubic
- 34 yard
- 35 Minimum charge..... \$ 6.50 per vehicle

1 2. Deposit of source separated yard waste at disposal
2 sites with yard waste facilities:

- 3 Passenger licensed vehicles..... \$ 4.00 Per entry
- 4 Other vehicles
- 5 Compacted wastes..... \$ 9.60 per cubic
- 6 yard
- 7 Uncompacted wastes..... \$ 5.25 per cubic
- 8 yard
- 9 Minimum charge..... \$ 4.00 per vehicle

10 C. Service fees at the Cedar Hills Landfill shall be:

- 11 Cedar Hills regional direct..... \$31.50 per ton
- 12 Other vehicles..... \$47.00 per ton

13 Disposal by other vehicles is at the discretion of the
14 solid waste manager. Any certificated hauler who has been
15 disposing solid waste at a rural landfill may be authorized by
16 the solid waste manager to dispose solid waste at the Cedar
17 Hills Regional Landfill on a temporary, emergency basis at the
18 regional direct fee.

19 D. Effective July 1, 1991, a moderate risk waste
20 surcharge shall be added to all solid waste disposed by non-
21 solid waste collection entities using county operated disposal
22 facilities. The fee schedule is as follows:

23 1. For sites with scales:

- 24 Self-Haulers.....\$ 2.61 per ton
- 25 Minimum Charge.....\$ 1.00 per entry
- 26 Passenger Licensed Vehicles.....\$ 1.00 per entry

27 2. For sites without scales:

- 28 Compacted.....\$.76 per cubic
- 29 yard
- 30 Uncompacted.....\$.44 per cubic
- 31 yard
- 32 Minimum Charge.....\$ 1.00 per entry
- 33 Passenger Licensed Vehicles.....\$ 1.00 per entry

34 ~~((D-)) E. ((Effective February 1, 1990, a))~~ A special
35 waste fee shall be charged for special wastes including

1 infectious waste treated and handled pursuant to King County
 2 board of health Code 10.28.070, asbestos-containing waste
 3 material, bulky waste, problem wastes, and other additional
 4 wastes requiring clearances pursuant to the King County Board
 5 of Health Code Title 10 or pursuant to rules promulgated by the
 6 Department.

7 Special Waste Fee..... \$ 75.00 per ton
 8 Minimum Charge..... \$ 10.50 per entry

9 ((F-)) F. In the absence of exact weights or
 10 measurements, the estimate of the manager shall be binding upon
 11 the user.

12 ((F-)) G. Special Service Fee. Solid waste generated.
 13 and/or collected within the boundaries of a jurisdiction which
 14 has not entered into an agreement with King County for use of
 15 King County solid waste disposal facilities as provided by this
 16 chapter may only be disposed of in a King County facility upon
 17 payment of a special service fee of three times the applicable
 18 per ton rate ((set forth above)) for facilities with scales and
 19 three times the applicable cubic yard rate ((set forth in
 20 subsection B)) for compacted or uncompact waste for
 21 facilities without scales. Payment of the special service fee
 22 in this subsection shall be in lieu of payment of the fees in
 23 subsections A - ((D)) H. Nothing in this subsection authorizes
 24 the use of King County facilities by any municipal corporation
 25 or agent thereof or any commercial hauler for disposal of solid
 26 waste generated and/or collected outside King County.

27 ((G-)) H. Effective date. Effective February 1, 1990, a
 28 monthly transfer shall be made from the Energy/Resource
 29 Recovery Fund to Solid Waste Operating Fund. The amount of the
 30 transfer shall be determined by adding the following:

- 31 1. The number of tons of solid waste disposed at the
 32 Basic Fee multiplied by \$7.00.
- 33 2. The number of tons of solid waste disposed at the
 34 Cedar Hills Regional Direct Fee multiplied by \$4.50.

1 3. The number of tons of source separated yard waste
2 disposed at the Yard Waste Fee multiplied by \$7.00.

3 SECTION 3. Ordinance 800, Section 3, as amended, and
4 K.C.C. 10.12.030, is hereby amended to read as follows:

5 Collection of fees. A. All service fees collected
6 pursuant to this chapter shall be collected in cash by site
7 cashiers at the time of use; provided, that the manager of the
8 King County solid waste division, department of public works
9 may authorize a commercial or noncommercial user to be billed
10 monthly for all solid waste delivered to the transfer stations
11 and/or final disposal sites.

12 B. The solid waste manager is authorized to adjust any
13 solid waste service fee for purposes of minimizing cash holding
14 requirements at solid waste facilities. The adjustment to the
15 calculated fee shall not exceed twenty-five cents nor shall it
16 have a significant impact on the revenue collected in the
17 proposed rate period.

18 ((B-)) C. Authorization of a commercial or noncommercial
19 user's monthly billing shall result from a request in advance
20 for such service by the commercial or noncommercial user.

21 1. No authorization shall be granted without the
22 posting of an irrevocable payment bond secured by the
23 commercial or noncommercial user in the name of the solid waste
24 division and in an amount which is equal to the larger amount
25 of the actual prior three months of user fee charges or \$2,500.

26 2. In the absence of the actual prior three months of
27 user fee charges, the irrevocable payment bond will be
28 determined by the larger amount of either an estimate by the
29 commercial or noncommercial user of three months of user
30 charges or \$2,500.

31 3. The amount of such bond may be changed by giving
32 thirty days' notice by the manager to reflect actual usage.

33 4. The manager, shall upon request, relieve a
34 commercial user certified pursuant to Chapter 81.77 RCW of the

1 requirement for an irrevocable payment bond if it has not been
2 delinquent in the preceding 12 months.

3 5. When the monthly bill is delinquent by five days the
4 user shall post within thirty days of the delinquency an
5 irrevocable bond equal to the larger amount of three month's
6 actual user charges or \$2,500.

7 6. The manager shall waive the irrevocable payment bond
8 for the following governmental noncommercial users: A
9 municipal corporation, governmental department, agency or
10 commission or political subdivision when he approves its month
11 billing request.

12 ((E-)) D. All invoiced fees shall be ~~((due and))~~
13 received, payable to King County, ~~((solid waste))~~ finance
14 division, in monthly installments on or before the
15 ~~((fifteenth))~~ twenty-fifth day following the billing date as
16 listed on the invoice ~~((or the date of posting, whichever is~~
17 ~~later))~~. A late payment penalty equal to one and one-half
18 percent of the delinquent unpaid balance compounded monthly,
19 shall be assessed on the delinquent unpaid balance of those
20 nongovernmental commercial and noncommercial accounts in
21 arrears. The manager, having given seven days' notice, may
22 suspend use privileges for a commercial or noncommercial user
23 who fails to tender payment by the end of the billing month.
24 Any invoiced fee or other service fee which remains unpaid
25 ninety days after its due date may be remitted to a collection
26 service agency which will exercise their best, prudent and
27 lawful efforts to secure collection. An administrative fee of
28 fifteen dollars will be added to all such unpaid account
29 totals. This fee will be in addition to any late payment
30 penalty or fee imposed by County ordinance.

31 E. Effective July 1, 1991, users not having charging
32 privileges and unable to pay disposal charges assessed at the
33 disposal facility shall be issued a one-time payment invoice of
34 dumping fees charged plus a handling fee of \$5.00. Payment on
35 this invoice shall be due within 7 days of issue and late

1 payment penalties shall be charged consistent with Subsection
2 (D) above.

3 ((B-)) F. A noncommercial user may be authorized by the
4 manager to be billed monthly for all solid waste delivered to
5 the transfer stations for final disposal sites; provided, that
6 such noncommercial user is either: 1. A municipal
7 corporation, governmental department, agency or commission or
8 political subdivision; or 2. a person whose monthly service
9 charge exceeds one hundred dollars.

10 ((E-)) G. Persons authorized for monthly billings shall
11 receive one or more identification badges for the purpose of
12 crediting charges. A fee of twenty-five dollars shall be
13 charged the person to replace a lost or damaged card. No fee
14 will be charged for replacement due to normal wear.

15 NEW SECTION. SECTION 1. There is added to K.C.C. Title
16 10.08 a new section to read as follows:

17 Reporting. Effective July 1, 1991, all solid waste
18 collection entities shall provide information to the manager on
19 their usage of King County solid waste facilities.

20 A. No later than 15 days after the end of each month,
21 solid waste collection entities shall report the amount of
22 residential and commercial tonnage hauled to each King County
23 solid waste facility, and identify the cities, towns or
24 unincorporated service areas from which each ton of waste
25 hauled by them originated.

26 B. Once each year, no later than March 31, solid waste
27 collection entities shall submit an annual tonnage forecast
28 which estimates the total amount of residential and commercial
29 tonnage and the number of residential and commercial accounts
30 by city, town or unincorporated service area for the current
31 year.

32 C. All information shall be reported on forms provided by
33 the county.

1 D. Any significant changes in patterns of usage of King
2 County solid waste facilities shall be reported to the manager
3 30 days in advance of the change.
