2 AN ORDINANCE relating to paid parking in County owned
3 parking facilities; and amending Ordinance 8753,
4 Sections 4, 5, 6 and 7; Ordinance 354, Sections 2 and
5 5; and K.C.C. Sections 3.32.005, 3.32.010, 3.32.040,
6 3.32.045, 3.32.055, and 3.32.090.

7 BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF KING COUNTY:

8 SECTION 1. Ordinance 8753, Section 4 and K.C.C. Section
9 3.32.005 are hereby amended to read as follows:

10 Location. County automotive parking facilities shall refer
11 to the parking spaces found in the following areas:

- 12 A. County automotive center, 5th and Jefferson.
13 B. County courthouse, 3rd and James.
14 C. County adult detention center, 5th and James.
15 D. Open surface lots located at 5th and Jefferson, and on
16 Yesler.

17 E. Yesler Building.

18 SECTION 2. Ordinance 3511, Section 2 and K.C.C. Section
19 3.32.010 are hereby amended to read as follows:

20 Administrative Regulations. Administrative regulations
21 adopted by the department of executive administration shall
22 include, but not be limited to the following subjects:

- 23 A. Identification of positions eligible for ((assigned))
24 reserved and unreserved parking;
25 B. Regulation of after-hours and weekend parking;
26 C. Enforcement procedures, including certification and
27 monitoring of carpools, and the establishment of procedures for
28 handling complaints;
29 D. Designation of the public parking area;
30 E. Prohibition of the resale of the parking stall
31 assignment((-)) ;

32 F. Designation of reserved and unreserved parking areas.

33 SECTION 3. Ordinance 3511, Section 5, as amended, and
34 K.C.C. Section 3.32.040 are hereby amended to read as follows:

1 Public Parking area. Parking space will be established
2 for public parking to be used in conjunction with county
3 business. (~~Said parking shall be limited to two hours.~~)
4 Members of the public on county business shall be charged for
5 all time parked. (~~in the event the two hour free limit is~~
6 ~~exceeded.~~) Exceptions can be made if they meet explicit
7 criteria for exemptions established in accordance with Section
8 3.32.010 and monitored by the King County auditor.

9 SECTION 4. Ordinance 8753, Section 6, as amended, and
10 K.C.C. Section 3.32.045 are hereby amended to read as follows:

11 Parking rates - surface parking lots. The parking rates
12 for parking in designated open surface parking lots shall be as
13 follows:

14 A. Daily (~~general~~) parking (~~on county business which~~
15 ~~exceeds the two hour limit, general public parking not on~~
16 ~~county business, and county employees not assigned regular~~
17 ~~parking stalls~~):

- 18 1. Effective January 1, 19(~~89~~) 92:
- 19 0 - 2 hours \$3.00
- 20 2 - 4 hours \$5.00
- 21 4 - 10 hours \$7.00
- 22 Special events (~~(\$6.00)~~) \$7.00

23 PROVIDED THAT:
24 (~~No e~~) County employees not permanently assigned to a
25 downtown work station shall pay no more than (~~(\$60.00)~~) \$75.00
26 in any calendar month for such unassigned parking.

27 2. Evenings after 6 p.m. and all day Saturday, Sunday
28 and legal holidays except during special events \$4.00

29 B. Special events rates - conditions. Special events
30 rates shall apply after 6 p.m. weekdays and all day Saturday,
31 Sunday and legal holidays and shall apply during those events
32 designated in accordance with Section 3.32.010. Parking for
33 special events shall be provided in surface lots and in the
34 county automotive center, provided that county employees who
35 pay for parking privileges in the automotive center shall be
36 exempted from payment of the special event fee.

1 SECTION 5. Ordinance 8753, Section 5, as amended, and
2 K.C.C. Section 3.32.055 is hereby amended as follows:

3 Parking rates - parking stalls. Effective ((P)) parking
4 rates ((-)) for January 1, 1992 parking stalls in the King
5 County automotive center, adult detention center, courthouse,
6 Yesler Building and open surface parking lots(~~(. The basic~~
7 ~~monthly parking rate for these parking stalls)) shall be as~~
8 follows:

14 PROVIDED THAT:
15 For disabled county employees whose disabilities make it
16 difficult or impossible to use public transit, and who display
17 a disabled parking permit, the fee for covered parking shall be
18 50 percent of the normal rate.

19 ((PROVIDED THAT:))
20 ((Upon acquisition these rates shall apply to the parking
21 facilities at the Yesler Building.)) Second and Third shift
22 employees who are authorized to use available unreserved
23 parking stalls on a regular basis within any of the county
24 owned parking facilities shall pay \$45.00 per month.

25 All county employees who are not assigned the use of a
26 reserved parking stall, or who are not authorized the use of
27 available unreserved parking areas on a regular basis, but who
28 have been authorized to park in the garage after hours and
29 weekends shall pay \$10.00 per month.

30 The executive will notify 2nd and 3rd shift employees of
31 the availability of escort service.

32 SECTION 6. Ordinance 8753, Section 7 and K.C.C. Section
33 3.32.090 are hereby amended to read as follows:

34 Parking fee revenues - disposition. All revenues derived
35 from parking fees ((rates)) shall be ((used to pay the

1 ~~operating expenses of county parking facilities and the bond~~
2 ~~retirement for the automotive center.)) distributed as follows:~~

3 ((~~PROVIDED THAT:~~))

4 All parking revenues derived from the increase of parking
5 rates for covered and uncovered effective on or after
6 January 1, 1989 shall be reserved for the support of health and
7 human services activities and shall be deposited in the Health
8 and Human Services Set-aside Fund.

9 PROVIDED THAT:

10 All revenue derived from elimination of free public
11 parking, and all revenue derived from second and third shift
12 unreserved parking by county employees and from occasional
13 after-hours and weekend parking from county employees, shall be
14 deposited in the Current Expense fund.
