AN ORDINANCE establishing the date for an election on the question of annexation of the City of Carnation into the King County Rural Library District and declaring an emergency.

FINDINGS OF FACT:

The City of Carnation, Washington by Ordinance No. 469, has initiated the proposed annexation and expressed its intent to join the King County Rural Library District, finding that the public interest will be served thereby. The Carnation library board has voted in support of annexation as confirmed in correspondence dated June 20, 1992.

City of Carnation Ordinance No. 469 does satisfy the provisions of RCW 27.12.010(5), and 27.12.360 requesting the calling of an election to be held among the qualified voters therein.

The Board of Trustees of the King County Rural Library District by Resolution No. 1992-4 has concurred with the proposal as submitted on June 25, 1992, all in accordance with RCW 27.12.360.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF KING COUNTY:

SECTION 1. A special election shall be held on the 15th day of September, 1992, within the City of Carnation. The ballot proposition shall be in substantially the following form in accordance with RCW 27.12.370:

"Shall the City of Carnation, Washington be annexed to and be part of the King County Rural Library District?"

SECTION 2. Notice of election shall be published as required by law.

SECTION 3. The county council finds as a fact and declares that an emergency exists and that this ordinance is necessary for the immediate preservation of public peace,
