AN ORDINANCE relating to fees charged for the use of King County park and recreation facilities fees, and amending Ordinance No. 5225, Section 2(A), as amended, and K.C.C. 7.08.020 and declaring an emergency.

PREAMBLE:

1. King County has traditionally operated a lifeguarded summer swim beach program with a lifeguard at Lake Garrett located in Lakewood Park.
2. The current drought has resulted in an extraordinarily low level of water in the lake, making the designated swimming area too shallow and too small for safe operation, and causing the guarded swim beach program to be canceled for this year.
3. King County operates an indoor swimming pool, Evergreen Pool, adjacent to the park and has determined it would be in the best interests of White Center citizens to provide a reasonable alternative to the swim beach program by providing free public swim periods in the pool.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF KING COUNTY:

SECTION 1. Ordinance No.1 5225, Section 2(A), as amended, and K.C.C. 7.08.020 are amended to read as follows:

Swimming pool facilities (except Weyerhaeuser King County Aquatics Center).

Surcharge Assessment of 10% on all fees and charges in this section except: Section A.

Swimming pool facilities fees shall be:

A. Swimming pool fees (fees include sales tax):

Public Swims ..... \$ 1.25 per person per session

Provided, however, that for Evergreen Pool only public swims shall be FREE for the period beginning on Monday, June 29, 1992 through Saturday, August 29, 1992 only; Mondays through Fridays from 2:00 p.m. - 4:00 p.m. and Saturdays from 1:00 p.m. to 3:00 p.m.

Seventy-five Cent Swims ..... \$ .75 per person per session

Adult Only Swims ..... 2.00 per person per session

1 Senior Citizens-60 years plus ... 1.25 per person for any  
 2 program session.

3 B. Swim lessons: \$1.00 per half hour to \$10.00 per  
 4 half hour

5 C. Pool rentals:

6 1. Private rentals

7 25 persons or less .....\$ 35.50 per hour  
 8 26 - 60 persons .....48.25 per hour  
 9 61 - 90 persons .....64.25 per hour  
 10 91 - 120 persons .....77.25 per hour  
 11 121 - 150 persons .....96.50 per hour

12 2. Special interest groups  
 13 ..... 27.75 per hour

14 3. School districts.....18.00 per hour

15 4. King County Park Swim Teams  
 16 When sharing the pool .....15.50 per hour  
 17 When using the entire pool .....23.00 per hour

18 D. Family membership program. (Entitles member to all  
 19 public swims and adults to all adult swims, including the  
 20 Recreation Pool in the King County Aquatic Center):

21 1. Three Months

22 Youth 17 years or younger .....\$ 41.75 plus sales tax  
 23 Adults, 18 years or older .....69.50 plus sales tax  
 24 Family, 2 or more .....100.00 plus sales tax  
 25 Senior citizens, 60 years or older 41.75 plus sales tax

26 2. Yearly  
 27 Youth, 17 years or younger .....\$110:00 plus sales tax  
 28 Adults, 18 years or older .....180.00 plus sales tax  
 29 Family, 2 or more .....260.50 plus sales tax  
 30 Senior citizens, 60 years or older 83.50 plus sales tax

31 E. Locker Fees ..... 0.25 per locker

32 F. Individuals with physical or developmental  
 33 disabilities shall receive the same rate as senior citizens.

1 G. Individuals with physical or developmental  
2 disabilities shall provide documented proof of disability to  
3 qualify for reduced fees.

4 H. Individual youths, 17 years or younger who can  
5 document their eligibility for free or reduced price school  
6 meals as established by the U.S. Department of Agriculture and  
7 thereafter revised shall qualify for free or reduced fee public  
8 swims.

9 I. Admission and/or concession fees - 10% of gross  
10 income.

11 SECTION 2. The county council finds as a fact and  
12 declares that an emergency exists and that this ordinance is  
13 necessary for the immediate preservation of public peace,  
14 health, or safety or for the support of county government and  
15 its existing public institutions.
