BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF KING COUNTY:

SECTION 1. There is hereby approved and adopted

appropriations of \$4,783,364 to Capital Project Transfers, \$9,763,447 to the Real Estate Excise Tax Fund and \$3,386,791 to Criminal Justice from the unappropriated fund balances of each fund to reinstated authority to transfer funds to various CIP projects previously authorized in 1991, but not made by the end of the fiscal year.
