ORDINANCE NO. **10669**

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AN ORDINANCE establishing the date for an election on the question of annexation of the City of Mercer Island into the King County Rural Library District; and declaring an emergency.

FINDINGS OF FACT:

The City of Mercer Island, Washington by Ordinance No. B-97, has initiated the proposed annexation and expressed its intent to join the King County Rural Library District, finding that the public interest will be served thereby. The Mercer Island Library Advisory Board as reflected in the minutes of a special meeting held on October 29, 1992, supports the ordinance.

City of Mercer Island Ordinance No. B-97 does satisfy the provisions of RCW 27.12.010(5), and 27.12.360 requesting the calling of an election to be held among the qualified voters therein.

The Board of Trustees of the King County Rural Library District by Resolution No. 1992-11 has concurred with the proposal as submitted on November 24, 1992, all in accordance with RCW 27.12.360.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF KING COUNTY:

SECTION 1. A special election shall be held on the 2nd day of February, 1993, within the City of Mercer Island. The ballot proposition as prepared and approved by the Mercer Island City Attorney shall read as follows:

"Shall the City of Mercer Island, Washington be annexed to and be part of the King County Rural Library District and thereby authorize the District to levy property taxes within the City in the amount not to exceed .5 mils per \$1000 of assessed valuation or as otherwise authorized by law?"

SECTION 2. Notice of election shall be published as required by law.


SECTION 3. The county council finds as a fact and declares that an emergency exists and that this ordinance is necessary for the immediate preservation of public peace,
